Congratulations to the cast and crew of *The Great Gatsby*, presented by the Visual and Performing Arts Department of Orange High School in association with Orange Preparatory Academy. Performances took place from December 5 – 7 at the Orange Preparatory Academy Auditorium. The actors gave stellar performances in the F. Scott Fitzgerald classic directed by Dana Levin, drama instructor at Orange High School. The play introduced many new stage crew members and actors showing interest in the stage for the first time. Supervisor of Visual and Performing Arts, Mr. Peter Crosta, who was present at the four performances, stated, "I think the most remarkable thing about this past production was the student actors being so darn convincing! I saw the play four times, not because I had to ... I really wanted to! It was that good"! He was accompanied on opening night by Superintendent of Schools, Ronald C. Lee, who remarked that he would have welcomed more performances of this wonderful production.

Under the direction of Ms. Levin, the students demonstrated their acting skills and how to deliver their character. "The bar had been raised", added Mr. Crosta. The students did an exemplary job, thanks to their hard work, belief in themselves and the training from a remarkable adult team. They hope to attract a much larger audience for their spring production of *Grease*.

The Great Gatsby, set in 1922, chronicles a tale of love and loss in the Jazz Age. Nick Carraway, played by Furqan Bilal, a new resident of Long Island's West Egg, stumbles upon a love triangle between his cousin, Daisy Buchanan, portrayed by senior Anaiyah Ramsey, her husband, Tom Buchanan played by Jean Fleurentin, in his stage debut, and the mysterious Jay Gatsby, played by seasoned actor, Emilio Del Villar. Lavish parties, speakeasies, and a trail of deceit paint the backdrop of this memorable story.

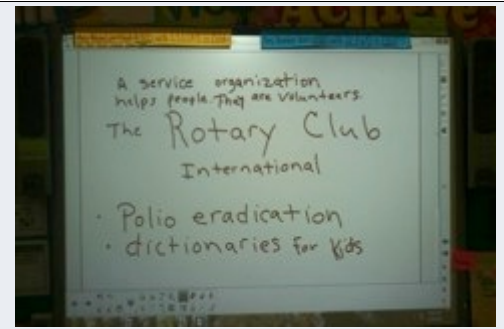
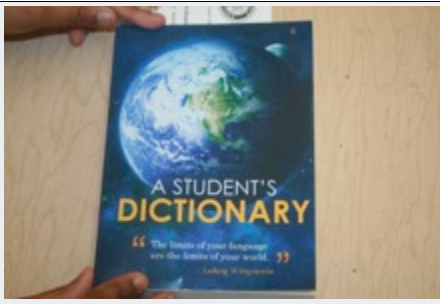


Cleveland 3rd Graders Get Dictionaries

Oakwood Avenue School Presents its "Reading Buddy Program"

Mrs. Lakenya Francis' "Reading Buddy Program", vision is to motivate students to love to read at the primary grades. Students in preschool buddy up with students in first grade. Students in kindergarten buddy up with students in second grade. The upper grades are excited to share a book with their buddy, as well as talk about each other's pictures during drawing time. Pre-schoolers and kindergarteners are excited and like to spend time with their buddy. They are all fully engaged! The process is simple but priceless. Once a month first and second graders go to their buddies' classrooms with books in hand. Each buddy reads a story to their companion. Afterwards, they spend quality time talking about their book, draw pictures or make other connection with the story.

The next month the preschoolers and kindergarteners travel to the main building to go to the first and second grade rooms. At this time, the upper grade students will read to their buddies. Each time they meet the students have been amazing!

Every other month, teachers in each group will take turns and present a skill to the whole group. The skills that are planned are reading for fluency, pointing to each word as you read, asking questions before/during/and after the story, and using pictures to predict what the story is about. Already, the program is seeing results; teachers have noticed that the buddy system has helped to motivate the student's self-confidence as independent readers. Likewise, the preschoolers are fully engaged and eager to read and communicate during reading time. They are becoming acquainted with showing and sharing their work.

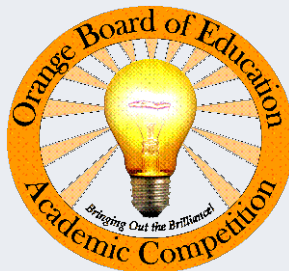

Horizon Community Development Offers Afterschool Services at Forest Street School

Horizons Community Development, Inc. (HCD) has entered into a partnership with the Forest Street School, to provide free afterschool services, between the hours of 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m., every Friday, for children between the ages of 5 and 15. The program, "Rising Above" Initiative is designed to give participants access to knowledge about the following three areas:

- Reading Acceleration (includes Tutoring and Homework Assistance)
- Healthy Lifestyles (supportive education about diet and positive alternatives for recreational activities)
- Young Entrepreneurs (examination of the world of finance, banking, commerce, money-making ideas and launching a business as a youth)

On December 13, Superintendent of Schools, Ronald C. Lee, visited the session with HCD CEO, Reverend John W. Rice, Jr., along with the Honorable Mayor, Dwayne D. Warren and Mr. Ronnie Sevilla, Branch Manager for Investors Bank in Livingston. The specifics of the program were discussed and classrooms were toured, greeting students who were also being assisted with their homework by HCD volunteers. Principal Yancisca Cooke was there to oversee the school's effort.

The "Rising Above" Initiative is partially supported with funding from the County of Essex via the Community Development Block Grant for 2012-2013. Investors Bank is also participating in this effort.

In 2012, HCD also received a grant for Direct Services to Youth which allows them to provide education and enrichment services via the "Rising Above" Initiative. The program was funded by the NJ Office of Faith-based Initiatives to serve all children between the ages of 5 and 15, especially those who reside in families with members who may be or have been incarcerated and/or are fighting against the ills of drug abuse.

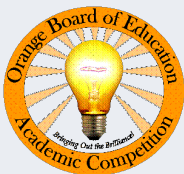

It began with Mr. Ederson Jean speaking about CISCO Networking Career options and certifications that students could obtain, as part of the curriculum at Orange High School. CompTIA, an IT trade association that provides training

in a variety of IT fields, was discussed. Students were made aware of topics like practical computer repair, including the installation and repair of hard drives, modems, network cards, CPUs, power supplies, PDAs, and printers.

Mr. Max Nixon, Technology instructor, addressed the group regarding STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) Careers, Top 10 Colleges that offered STEM degrees and different assignments that students could complete in the SmartLab, such as Alternative Energy, Circuitry, Computer Graphics, Digital Communications, Mechanics and Structures, Robotics and Control Technology and Scientific Data and Analysis, that will prepare them for an exciting future in STEM.

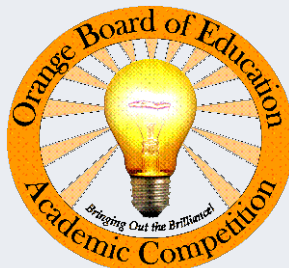
