On Thursday, the Fair will be open for public viewing from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. There will be student presentations (grades 8-12) from 12:45-

2:45 p.m., excitement for families including hands-on activities, competitions and dissections, from 3 - 5 p.m., and an awards ceremony, from 5:30 – 7:30 p.m. The Science Fair will feature award-winning exhibits by second through twelfth grade students, as well as fun-filled Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) inspired demonstrations. All are invited to join this showcase of academic excellence and celebrate student winners and their schools. Refreshments, prizes and more will be provided.

# **Family Math Night**



Over 200 students, parents, and teachers filled the gymnasium at the Rosa Parks Community School for the Orange School District's Family Math Night on May 27. Ms. Asale Harris, Supervisor of Mathematics, Grades 3-5, coordinated the event for the Science and Mathematics Department, under the leadership of its Director, Dr. Tina Powell. The theme of the event was a carnival, replete with

balloons and a DJ. There were various math stations with math games such as *Game 24*, the *Geometry Marshmallow* station, *Factors and Products Game* station, *Roller Derby* (dice), *Plinko*, and more.

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At each station, staffed by teachers and district administrators, students earned "math bucks" for trade for raffle tickets and a chance to win valuable prizes. At the end of the evening, there were several winners who when home with bicycles, a Samsung camera, video games, gift cards and math board games. Each child in attendance received a gift bag filled with math supplies and games to help parents and children apply math strategies that can be used at home and in school.

# Highlights from the May Monthly Board of Education Meeting








