The second set of tests for the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC), called End of Year (EOY) Assessment, are being administered now through May 22 to students in grades 3-11. The first phase of assessment, the Performance Based Assessment (PBA), was completed during the period of March 2 - April 2.

Next Steps for Strategic Planning Meeting

The Orange Board of Education held the last of three meetings, on April 27, organized to construct a Strategic Plan for the Orange Public School District. The two previous meetings satisfied the following:

- 1. Outlined the strengths, achievements and challenges of the Orange Public Schools
- 2. Drafted a vision for the Orange Township Public Schools over the next five years

At the final session, participants, including staff, students, district administrators, city officials and members of the community, broke up into 4 groups based on the following goal areas: 21st Century Learning, Community Engagement and Outreach, Culture & Climate, and Finance & Facilities/Safety.

The task for each group was to write a broad statement for each goal area and develop 4 - 5 objectives based on the common threads from all previous work.

Ms. Charlene Peterson and Mr. Al Annunziata, from the New Jersey School Boards Association (NJSBA), facilitated the meeting. They thanked the participants for their involvement.



On April 29, Heywood Avenue fourth grader, Briana Duchene, received an award as a finalist, from "Partnership for a Drug-Free New Jersey in Cooperation with the Governors Council on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse and the NJ Department of Human Services," for her entry into the 4th Grade Folder Contest.

All fourth grade students at Heywood Avenue School participated in the "fun things to do instead of drugs" folder contest, in the late fall. Over 360 schools across New Jersey participated with over 8000 student artworks submitted for consideration. Mock Trial at Orange Preparatory Academy for Law Day

Essex Vicinage Office of the Ombudsman, in partnership with the Essex County Bar Association (ECBA), arranged for judges and members of the ECBA to visit OPA and other local participating schools to assist with conducting the mock trials. "The purpose of this activity is for students to develop an understanding of the trial process, the roles of those in the courtroom, their importance to the administration of justice, and the significance of their constitutional protections."

The case enacted by the students, *The State of New Jersey v. Junior N. Nocent* sought to resolve a hypothetical dispute "Who's the thief at Jobs Computer Store?" The proceedings involved, the Honorable Verna G. Leath, J.S.C, Presiding, student Attorney for the State, Andrew Coates, supported by Attorney Yasmine McMorrin and students Defense Attorney, Shahyan Abraham, supported by Attorney Jessica A. Buffman.

After closing arguments were heard, the judge gave detailed instructions to the jury, offering legal definitions and clarity for jury deliberation. The verdict rendered for the defendant, played by Leodson Jean Baptiste, was innocent of the charge of theft (shoplifting) and guilty of the charge of criminal mischief.




Digital Day of Learning at Park Avenue School
