# The Board of Education Approves District Calendar Changes at the Monthly Board of Education Meeting

Due to Hurricane Sandy, schools were closed for 7 days, from October 29<sup>th</sup> through November 6<sup>th</sup>, leaving students with less than the required mandatory school days. There are three "snow" or inclement weather days built into the calendar for students, leaving four days to be made up. In order to meet New Jersey State statute requiring 180 days of school and to provide additional professional development for staff, the Orange Board of Education approved several changes to the existing district calendar for the 2012 – 2013 school year.

- Schools were open on November 8 and 9 in place of the canceled New Jersey Teachers' Convention, making up 2 days missed due to the storm.
- Students will have school on, February 2, 2013 and the staff Professional Development (PD) will be cancelled, making up a third day missed due to Sandy.
- Schools will be open for a half-day on Good Friday, March 29, 2013, making up the final day lost from "Superstorm Sandy".
- To facilitate additional PD, students will be dismissed at 2:30 p.m. every third Monday of the month (with a few exceptions). The early dismissal is only on these dates, unless otherwise denoted on the calendar. The specific days are: November 19, 2012, December 17, 2012, January 28, 2013, February 25, 2013, March 18, 2013, April 22, 2013, May 20, 2013, and June 17, 2013.

In the event there are additional days off due to inclement weather, other calendar changes will have to be made.



#### Live Cardiac Surgery - An Eye-Opening Experience for Students

Dressed in their lab coats, Orange High School students absorbed the live, interactive, broadcast of open-heart surgery on the morning of November 12. Organized and hosted by Dr. Patrick Howell, one of the Assistant Principals at OHS, students and guests eagerly viewed the open-heart coronary bypass surgical procedure performed on a 57-year-old female at Morristown Memorial Hospital. The broadcast was made possible through Liberty Science Center's "Live From...Cardiac Classroom™". Students were given a briefing on the procedure, shown how nurses and doctors prepare for surgery, asked questions of the moderator from the broadcast site regarding their knowledge of the heart and given information about the function of the heart and contributing factors that would give rise to the surgery performed. Students, some of whom were skeptical of the opportunity presented to them, left with broadened experiences and ideas regarding career paths.

Some of the student comments were:

- "It provided me with the opportunity to learn more about the cardiovascular system, along with the different diseases that can affect the heart." Serena Constant
- "If I could view this surgery again, I would take that opportunity because it was a life changing experience." Joheuhha Faison
- "The surgery bypass on the heart was extremely interesting and exciting . . ." Athena Smith
- "When I was given a chance to participate in the live open heart surgery, I was a bit skeptical. I thought that it would just be a lecture or something along those lines. Instead it was an open door to a world that I knew very little about . . . All in all, it was a character building experience . . . " Alaya Montgomery
- "This event was a very influential factor in my life based on my career pathway. It has greatly increased my desire and elevated my anticipation to soon be that doctor . . . performing the heart surgery to influence other lives . . ." Nelly Bobo

For his part, Dr. Howell commented positively regarding the "detailed questions" and the "high intelligence of our students." He stated, "The students are being challenged above their grade level, but the challenge works both ways. Their questions help me to carry out future presentations." He is already planning an upcoming session on December 19, 2012 involving the removal of uterine fibroids that could include a partial or total hysterectomy. The Surgical Robotic Team from Newark Beth Israel Hospital will perform the surgery. He is thrilled to be able to open more students to careers in medicine by exposing them to these surgical procedures. "It is amazing that so many of our students would like to pursue careers in health related fields. A high percentage of our students are seriously considering becoming operating room nurses and surgeons.
