Good Day Orange Township Public School District Community,

I write to address recent information received today regarding the current COVID-19 pandemic and its impact on our school community. We have been informed that students/staff at the following schools have tested positive or been directly exposed to COVID-19 and are required to quarantine. Please note, any persons deemed to have been in close contact with the staff/student will receive direct communication from either the Orange Health Department or the District.

- 1. Orange Preparatory Academy
- 2. Lincoln Avenue School
- 3. Rosa Parks Community School
- 4. Park Avenue School
- 5. Cleveland Street
- 6. Heywood Avenue Elementary School

Given the nature of this pandemic, we continue to trust that the Orange Health Department will guide the community through whatever processes are necessary at this time. The Orange Township Public School District will continue to work closely with public health officials, assist in any manner possible, and keep our school community well informed.

Please understand that due to state and federal privacy laws, we will not be able to share specific information with you. The local health department will handle any notifications. In accordance with state laws, we expect the health department will perform a disease investigation to identify where the individual lives and close contacts that may be at additional risk and recent places of travel. When close contacts are identified, they will be informed to self-quarantine for a period of up to 14 days. Should individuals develop symptoms (fever, cough, or difficulty breathing) during the 14 days or receive a confirmed laboratory report for COVID-19, they must contact their local health department.

Due to the evolving nature of information, residents are encouraged to contact the 24/7 NJ COVID-19 Call Center at 1-800-222-1222 or 1-800-962-1253 if calling from a non-NJ cell phone for the most up to date information. New Jersey residents can also call NJ 211 with questions or concerns about COVID-19 by calling 2-1-1. NJ 211 is New Jersey's statewide comprehensive information and referral service operated by United Way of New Jersey. Residents can also text NJCOVID to 898-211 to receive text information and stay informed. To receive live text assistance, residents can text their zip code to 898-211.
