January's Instructional Focus

- Reading and Writing Grades K-12
- How are the conferences configured? What feedback are students given?
- Instructional comments to generate thinking are mandatory. In fact, words such as good job or excellent do not compel students to reflect on their work. What is good (use the rubric language and provide feedback to strengthen a piece.)
- In your packets are samples of writing. These samples will give you a look into the rigor embedded in this area. Also, the corresponding rubric is also evident as well. In the time of NJASK or ESPA/GEPA you would see holistic scoring where students would receive an overall score of a 1-4. In the PARCC/NJSLA era, students receive scores based on competency.

Importance of Writing

- Purpose is the reason why we write, and we write for many different purposes. There are many ways to achieve your writing purpose: choose a form, choose the correct language, choose the style, organization, and kinds of evidence.
- Here are some questions students should consider when deciding on writing purpose:
- Are you trying to sound more personal or authoritative?
- Are you wanting to entertain or inform?
- Are you relating to your audience or keeping the audience distant?
- Do you want to sound formal or informal?
- Focusing on writing purpose will give students a rhetorical sense to their writing. This will also help students be aware of the audience for which they are writing.

Clearly organize your narrative using transitional words and phrases to show the sequence of events. | Narrative W3 |


