

- There are a few ideals that I want to share with you as it relates to the reopening of schools; the voices of our families, staff, students, and Board of Education members will be fluid throughout the plan. We thank all staff and families who completed the survey to provide critical feedback.

Purpose of the Reopening of Schools Committee

On Friday, June 26, 2020, Governor Murphy announced that school will reopen in September, keeping in mind health precautions to ensure the safety of all students and staff. With that being said, the Reopening of Schools Plan will incorporate the voices of staff, Board of Education Members, health officials, and families. These representatives will evaluate the state guidelines and requirements released by Governor Murphy in order to provide input and recommendations into the district's reopening plan. As stated by Governor Murphy, "there is no one-size fits all approach to suit the unique challenges faced by each school district across the state."

- Per the Road Back Document released by the New Jersey Department of Education, there are 4 key areas for discussion:
- ➤ 1. Conditions for Learning 2. Leadership and Planning 3. Policy and Funding
 - 4. Continuity of Learning

Considerations: Instructional Time

- Instruction must occur 180 instructional days (as defined by the district calendar and can be in person or virtual)
- School day consists of not less than 4 hours for Grades 1-12, not less than 2.5 hours for kindergarten.
- Hours of instructional time are not defined as a student's time in front of a teacher or in front of a screen, but time engaged in standardsbased learning under the guidance and direction of a teacher."



Considerations: Standards for Health & Safety

- Masks are required wherever social distancing cannot be accomplished
- Access to PPE (Personal Protective Equipment), hand sanitizer, partitions (if applicable) etc.
- Potential staffing shortages
- Daily Cleaning/sanitizing demands
- ➤ Educational Effectiveness while Social Distancing
- > Contingency plan for re-closure
- Accommodating "At-Risk" students and staff

What is Collected?

- Incidents occurring on school grounds
 - O **Violence** (assault, fight, robbery, sexual assault, etc.)
 - **Vandalism** (arson, computer trespass, theft, trespass, etc.)
 - **Substance offense** (possession, sale and/or distribution)
 - O Weapons offense (air guns, toy guns, bb guns or pellet guns)
- Incidents occurring on and off school grounds
 - O Harassment, intimidation, or bullying (HIB)
 - Other incidents leading to removal
- HIB trainings
- HIB programs

When Do We Report

• All New Jersey Public Schools must report twice in a school year:

- Report Period 1: September December
- Report Period 2: January June
