- Final Snow Day Give Back: June 18th....So, there was a decision about the final snow day that had to be given back for this school year. Schools and the District Offices will be closed. Why was June 18th chosen? June 18th was chosen in accordance with Juneteenth.
- Juneteenth (short for "June Nineteenth") marks the day when federal troops arrived in <u>Galveston</u>, <u>Texas</u> in 1865 to take control of the state and ensure that all enslaved people be freed. The troops' arrival came a full two and a half years after the signing of the <u>Emancipation Proclamation</u>. Juneteenth honors the end to slavery in the United States and is considered the longest-running African American holiday.
- So much has happened in our nation and what better way to reflect and celebrate Juneteenth as a school community.

- The CRRSA Act includes the same 12 authorized uses as CARES ESSER I (including uses authorized under ESEA, IDEA, Perkins V, and McKinney-Vento), with a distinct emphasis on the following additional uses: Addressing student learning loss, to include administering and using high-quality assessments that are valid and reliable to accurately assess students' academic progress; School facility repairs and improvement to enable operations of schools to reduce the risk of virus transmission and exposure to environmental health hazards; and Projects to improve indoor air quality in school facilities, including HVAC, window, and door repair, replacement, and/or upgrading.
- The ESSER II funding for over 7.7 million that we received has to be earmarked no later than June 1st. Thank you to Dr. Powell, Dr. Russo Ms. Harper, Ms. Harris as well as Dr. Izbicki, Ms. Dismuke, Mr. Vasquez, and Mr. Cordes alongside me have met and allocated accordingly. Staff, students, and community, we heard you....Thank you for your continued input.

- Heywood Avenue School received their Distinguished School Status for the Project Lead the Way Program! This is such great news for Heywood!! Three YEARS in a ROW. Once a Wildcat; Always a Wildcat!
- College Decision Day Program for OHS took place on Wednesday, May 19th! STEM Innovation Academy of the Oranges had their College Decision Day on Wednesday, June 2nd. Next up is the Twilight Program who will host their College Decision Day tomorrow. We are so very proud of our SENIORS!

- Orange's very own, Melanie Laveriano, a highly motivated 8th Grade student currently attending Orange Preparatory Academy and enrolled in the Scholars MS Program @STEM where she is taking coding classes, was accepted into the WOLFRAM Middle School Summer Camp!!!
- The Wolfram Middle School Summer Camp is an **intensive** one-week program designed to advance middle-school girls' programming and problem-solving skills.
- The application process is intense with <u>fewer than 25 students</u> accepted nationwide each year!!

- Wolfram Alpha is an extremely popular and unique engine for computing answers and providing knowledge. It works by using its vast store of expert-level algorithms mimicking artificial intelligence to automatically answer questions, do analysis, and generate reports.
- Through lectures and activities lead by Wolfram instructors, students in the Camp will use the **Wolfram Coding Language** to learn and apply computational thinking skills.
- Melanie will take part in this prestigious program from June 14th through June 18th. Way to go Melanie. We are so proud of you!

Special Congratulations to Ms. Rawls and Ms. Hunter from Heywood Avenue and Forest Street Schools

- Congratulations to Ms. Hunter and Ms. Rawls for outstanding mathematics teaching and leadership. Both teachers successfully completed the competitive New Jersey STEM Innovation Fellowship program as the first cohort. As fellows, both teachers joined a statewide cohort of 28 elementary teachers and coaches from 24 districts. The teachers have implemented number strings using effective pedagogies while participating in professional learning communities led by faculty of Montclair State, Princeton, and Rowan Universities.
- Both teachers will be invited to apply to the newly formed NJ STEM Emeritus fellowship. This new fellowship will be an opportunity for teachers to remain active in the NJ STEM Innovation community after their fellowship has ended. This is a unique and competitive leadership program, whose goals are to keep knowledgeable and skillful teachers in the classroom, working directly with students, while also developing their capacity to mentor colleagues and provide instructional leadership within their schools. This is awesome news...Join me in Congratulating Ms. Rawls and Ms. Hunter!
