Curriculum Revisions

- I have read about 20 curriculum documents as shared at the Curriculum Sub Committee of the Board of Education Meeting held September 24th. I made notes for revisions accordingly.
- We are working with the Cornwall Center out of Rutgers University. We are also partnering with the Newark Board of Education (Newark Public Schools) in the effort of sharing resources in order to strengthen Latino X, Native American, and Amistad Curriculum Integration.

Commissioner of Education Convocation held on October 8, 2019

- Today, Mrs. Jones-Dismuke, Mr. James, and myself attended the Commissioner of Education's Convocation in Parsippany.
- From Design Thinking (refers to the cognitive, strategic, and practical processes by which design concepts (proposals for new products, buildings, machines, etc.) are developed by designers and/or design teams to ensuring that teachers, administrators, parents voices are heard when redesigning an ecosystem.
- Dr. Repollet shared the importance a stronger and fair education blueprint for the state. Becoming a model organization, strengthen teaching, leading, and learning.

Commissioner of Education Convocation held on October 8, 2019

• The Commissioner spoke at length about the importance of getting the state's narrative out there and the ones to do it are us. We have a district sub goal that speaks to this:

When Is the Report Shared?

• All New Jersey Public Schools must report twice in a school year:

- Report Period 1: September December
- Report Period 2: January June






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
OHS vs. Global SAT Averages
