## **Special Board of Education Meeting**



A Special Board of Education Meeting was held, on January 23, at the Board of Education Administrative Office. The meeting was called to address a legal matter, which involved the vote on a resolution to appoint the law firm of Schwartz Simon Edelstein & Celso, LLC as special counsel to the Orange Board of Education. After hearing public comments, questions and concerns, the board voted to retain counsel to present an injunction to the upcoming election of two board of education members. The election was scheduled for March 14, after the citizenry voted, in November, to implement an elected Board of Education vs. a board appointed by the mayor.

The meeting attendees, made up of community activists, clergy, former board member, parents and several interested in running for the new board positions, were informed that the move to an elective board would change the district designation from Type I to Type II thereby creating the potential loss of funding for much needed facilities improvements.

The next monthly Board of Education Meeting will be held on Tuesday, February 14, at 7:00 p.m., at Orange Preparatory Academy.




