Heywood Avenue School Color Me for Technology Event

At Orange Park on April 29, Heywood Avenue School hosted it's first ever, in fact the district's first, Color Run Fundraiser. The event, "Color Me for Technology," enjoyed a beautiful morning for an exhilarating run fueled by the school's very own DJ, Mr. Anthony St. Jean, technology coordinator, and led in a warm-up exercise by physical education teacher, Mr. Schuyler Fannell. Principal Faith Alcantara greeted participants with welcome remarks and instructions for the run. There were many helpers for the event, organized by Mrs. Mary Beth Barrios, 1st-grade teacher, and "My School Color Run" coordinator. They laid out water, snacks, and handed out pouches of color powder to single the end of the event. Students were armed with spray canisters to douse runners with watercolor as they circled the park and crossed the finish line.

Over 200 Heywood and district families, friends and staff registered to participate, including Deputy Superintendent Dr. Paula E. Howard, Orange Councilwoman, the Honorable Jamie Summers-Johnson, who co-sponsored the event along with the 21st Century Community Learning Centers, and Board of Education President, Ms. Christina Mateo. Ms. Mateo added to the color explosion of the day by offering face painting to students. Participants were clad in their color run T-shirts, running gear and other colorful attire such as tutus. There were physical fitness games and vendors for all to enjoy. The goal of the event was to raise \$4,000, to help purchase more technology equipment for Heywood Avenue School. The successful event surpassed the goal and provided a family friendly activity for the community.

Spelling Bee Winners





The Vice President of the Board, Mr. E. Lydell Carter presented a review of the board's attendance at the National School Board Association Annual Conference in Denver, March 25 - March 27. He spoke positively of the experience, voicing his appreciation for the forum and the information it provided. He reviewed the current administrations proposed 13.5% funding reduction for the Department of Education resulting in \$9.2 billion slashed from the department, cuts in teacher professional development and decreases in afterschool programs for students. Mr. Carter, on behalf of the board, outlined efforts the Orange community can implement to advocate for school funding support, including reaching out to public officials and organizing grassroots events to promote public education.

Orange Early Childhood Center parent, Ms. Helen Cuxil, exemplifies how to live your life believing your glass is always half full, and not half empty. Ms. Cuxil became a preschool parent when her daughter Chastlyn entered Orange's preschool program a few years ago. She was nervous, scared, and unfamiliar with the program, but none of this stopped her from asking questions. Shortly thereafter, she began asking if there was anything that she could do around the school. She would help the teachers,

the social workers, and other parents. She was also an active participant in the Early Childhood Department's first Latino Family Literacy Group and the STARS and TWINKLES program.

Now, Ms. Cuxil has her second child in preschool, and as her children have grown so has she. Ms. Cuxil is feeling more comfortable speaking English and has learned to advocate for her children and herself. Ms. Cuxil continues to be a valuable volunteer at the Orange Early Childhood Center. She was a tremendous help at the recent registration fair where she served as a translator during the registration process. She volunteered her services for the entire day as over 112 families were registered. Ms. Cuxil is now a valuable member of the registration team and will assist each week during scheduled registration. In addition, she has made phones calls to families about special school events, she has assisted the nurse with the children's screenings and she continues to volunteer her services in the classroom. Whenever she is available, Ms. Cuxil stops by the office after drop-off, to volunteer.

April 26 Special Board of Education Meeting

On April 26, the Board of Education convened a special meeting at the Board of Education Administrative Office to report on the April 13 court ruling that made the March 28 board member election null and void. The ruling by Superior Court Judge Thomas Vena granted the Board of Education's injunction to reverse the referendum vote to move from an appointed to an elected board and voided the election of two new members to the board. The decision also reinstated a \$2.6 million bond to fund much needed building upgrades, repairs and the facilitation of the district's STEM high school. For more information see:

At the meeting, the board members also discussed, with the bond council representative, how quickly the \$2.6 million bond could be issued. While an optimistic view was given, more definitive details are forthcoming after meetings with city officials. Also, a Board of School Estimates public meeting, to present the 2017-2018 School Year Budget, was announced. The meeting will be held on Friday, May 5, 6:30 p.m. at the Board of Education Administrative Offices, at 451 Lincoln Avenue.
