Regina Nadbielny of Scholars Academy named NJ Association for Gifted Children Teacher of the Year

Representing the Orange School District, Mrs. Regina McKenna Nadbielny (**pictured left**) is the recipient of New Jersey's Association for Gifted Children (NJAGC) Teacher of the Year award. She will be recognized at the Annual Awards Celebration on Thursday, March 21, 2019 in Princeton, NJ. Principal Karen Machuca is extremely proud of the Orange School District being acknowledged for the work that Mrs. Nadbielny has contributed and dedicated to the students in the gifted and talented program. "Mrs. Nadbielny is passionate about her teaching and is always looking for ways to enhance and strengthen the program in the best interest of students. This is a great way to kick off Gifted and Talented Awareness Month!

Regina McKenna Nadbielny has been the STEM/STEAM teacher for K-8 G&T students in Orange, for the last five years. With a background in Computer Science and Math, she previously spent 11 years as a programmer on Wall Street. She earned her Master's degree in Education with a concentration in Instructional Design and Technology from Seton Hall University in 2014 and is currently enrolled in the Rutgers Gifted Education certificate program.

A central part of her STEM philosophy is that every project has cross-curricular connections. For example, she entered her 4th grade students in a Scholastic toy contest where students had to design, draw, write about, and build their own toys. She often uses “outside-the-box” equipment and “free” field trips to enhance her students’ learning experiences. She has taken students to the Museum of Early Trades and Crafts, utilized the James Dyson Foundation Design Process Box and the Engineering Box and the Mattel Hot Wheels classroom kit to teach acceleration, velocity, and kinetic and potential energy.

She is a strong advocate for having her students learn to code, which helps them develop their computational thinking, time management, and strategy skills. This fall, her 4th and 5th grade students made it into the finals of the Cyber Robotics Coding Competition, where they competed against other NJ middle schools. Students coded virtual 3D robots to perform complex tasks and missions.

Regina’s professional memberships include the Aerospace Education division of the Civil Air Patrol; Essex County Steering Committee for Gifted and Talented Education; NJ Makers Consortium through Seton Hall University; and the Computer Science Teachers Association of New Jersey. She is a member of NJAGC and attends the conference each year. Last summer she attended the week-long Confratute at UCONN.

Regina recently won the Joyce VanTassel-Baska Scholarship Endowment funds annual scholarship award. At this year’s Superintendent Forum, Regina received the Orange Board of Education 2018 Superintendent’s Employee of the Year Award.

Lunch and Learn at STEM Innovation Academy

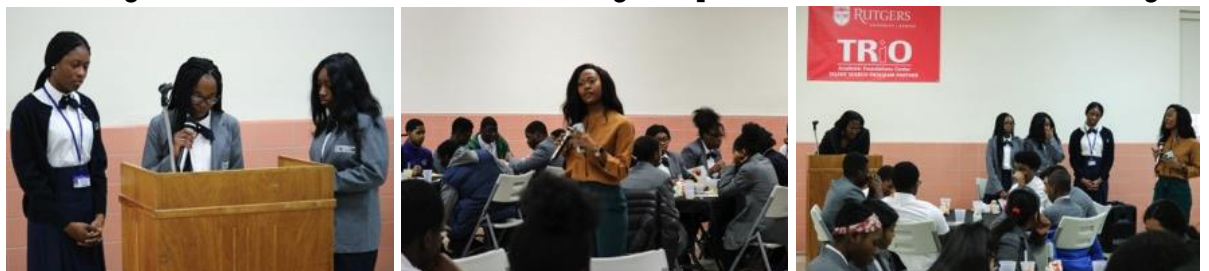
A dynamic entrepreneur impressed and challenged students during the Lunch and Learn session on February 8 at the STEM Innovation Academy of the Oranges. Jasmine Stith (***pictured right***), also known as “The Pretty Plug,” is the CEO and Founder of Faith Tech Grow (FTG), LLC. An IT professional by day, she is focused on the field of technology.



The mission of FTG, LLC is to provide a holistic perspective to increase/improve businesses using technology as the cornerstone. Ms. Stith highlighted this by questioning students regarding how technology has impacted a variety of industries and how it has changed their lives. She discussed being the host of the “Walk by Faith” podcast, where the mission is to highlight inspirational beings anywhere and everywhere.

Ms. Stith discussed her educational background with her audience. She is an alumna of a Historical Black College University, Prairie View A& M, where she studied electrical engineering and led various organizations. During her college career she mentioned failing a course but not letting it derail her goals and offered inspiration for students to strive for academic achievement. Described as a lover of technology, “vlogging,” critiquing fried chicken, and linking people to success to create opportunities, she is a firm believer of the phrase: my network is your network.

After her session with the students, Ms. Stith took a brief tour of the school and spent time in a mentoring session with several students offering critique and recommendations for change.

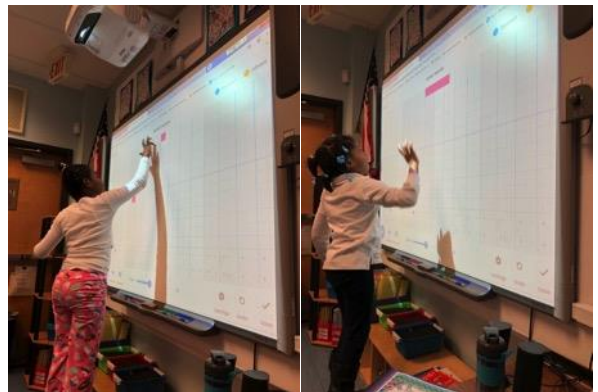

Literacy Escape Rooms at Heywood

The Magic Tree House Room had activities for Grades K-2. Ms. Hill, Kindergarten teacher, designed her “escape card” to spell out the word READ. Parents were encouraged to complete each challenge. Once each challenge was completed they could earn their way out of the room.

The Cookie Bandit Room had activities for Grades 2-3. It included a series of five challenges connecting high-frequency words to context clues, responding to text, and translating what you know to other subjects students will come in contact with in school. Parents had to complete each challenge and earn their “cookies” to escape the room.

The Library Mystery Room was geared towards 4-7th grades. This room included challenges using the Chromebook to input combinations from the clues provided to “escape the room”. Needless to say, only one family could escape!

At the end of the experience, parents were given a survey. One hundred percent of parents liked and would recommend the experience. The main concern brought up was that there wasn’t enough time to complete all of the rooms! The literacy night team thoroughly enjoyed this experience and can’t wait to plan more in the future!

Orange School District Preschool Registration Fair



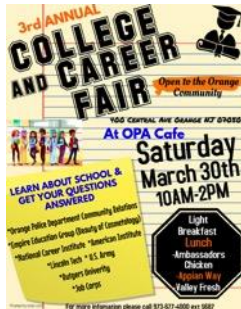
The Orange Public School District will host a Registration Fair on Saturday, March 16, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at the Orange Early Childhood Center (OECC), located at 397 Park Avenue in Orange. The last sign-in is 1:00 p.m. The Orange Board of Education provides a full day preschool education for all three and four year old residents of Orange. There is no fee for the school day (8:30 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.). The requirements are:

- 3 or 4 years old by 10/01/19
- Must be resident of Orange Township
- Original Birth Certificate
- Child's Immunization Record
- Current Lease or Mortgage Statement
- 2 Additional Proofs of Residency (i.e. PSE&G bill, telephone or cable bill)
- Picture ID of the Parent

Before and after school care is available. The fee for this additional program is based upon income eligibility.

At the Registration Fair, staff will be on hand to give an overview of the Early Childhood Program, and on-site registration will be completed for parents who bring the required documentation.

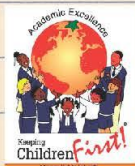
