The project, led by the teachers of history and social studies in the district, is based on the Days of Remembrance, when thousands of people worldwide will wear paperclips on their collars to demonstrate support for equality and respect for everyone.

The paperclip campaign is a grass-roots effort started by one teacher and her students in Academy School District Twenty (Colorado Springs) to honor the victims of the Holocaust and to state visibly that we each have a personal responsibility to ensure that it never happens again. http://www.paperclipcampaign.com/

The significance of the paperclip is explained on this website:

Prior to starting this campaign, we verified that Norwegians wore paperclips as a form of resistance. In his book, The Evolution of Useful Things, Henry Petroski wrote about the paperclip. "Norwegians are said to have remembered proudly the humble item's origins in their country, when during World War II, they 'fastened paper clips to their jacket lapels to show patriotism and irritate the Germans.' Wearing a paper clip could result in arrest, but the function of the device 'to bind together' took on the fiercely symbolic meaning of 'people joining against the forces of occupation.'" (Random House, 1992, p. 60)

Congressman Donald M. Payne, Jr. to Visit Orange Preparatory Academy



Congressman Donald M. Payne, Jr. will visit Orange Preparatory Academy on Monday, May 6, at 1:15 p.m. His visit is part of the SIFMA Foundation's Annual Stock Market Game™ Capitol Hill Challenge (CHC). One of the hallmarks of CHC is a visit to a participating school by the Member of Congress responsible for their district. This year, approximately 14,000 middle and high school students will compete across all 50 states.

Students of Mr. Glenn Gamble, business educator, are participating in the challenge and will be present for the visit, along with select students, district administrators, dignitaries, and guests. The competition began on February 4 and runs through May 10, 2019.

The Capitol Hill Challenge™ matches Members of Congress with schools across the country participating in the Stock Market Game. Winners receive a paid trip to Washington, DC to meet their Member of Congress, tour financial landmarks, and learn first-hand about financial policy making. Since its inception in 2004, the Capitol Hill Challenge has made over 3,800 matches of U.S. Representatives and Senators with schools, encompassing more than 103,000 students across the country.
