Welcome Back – Schools Open Monday, September 10, 2018

Welcome to the 2018-2019 school year. New and existing staff members began the school year on September 4, with the annual Superintendent's Forum. At the forum, Interim Superintendent of Schools, Mr. Ronald C. Lee, welcomed staff to an exciting school year, with the message - Orange Public Schools, "Where We Do Great Things." Interim Superintendent Lee gave a broad overview of the district and introduced new administrators and district changes, in preparation for the arrival of students on Monday, September 10.

District Schools and Administrative Changes:

This school year sees the opening of a new alternative program for students in Grades 6-8, which will be led by principal Dr. Cayce Cummins, at the former Career and Innovation Academy of the Oranges (CIAO).

The alternative program for students in Grades 9 - 12, formerly at CIAO, will return to Orange High School and be directed by newly appointed Assistant Principal Lyle Wallace, during the hours of 3:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m., weekdays.



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Dr. Erica Stewart is the new principal of the STEM Innovation Academy of the Oranges, which now serves over 90 students in grades 9 and 10. With the expansion of the school and plans to increase opportunities for students, Ms. Devonii Reid will join the administrative team as assistant principal.

Mr. Robert Pettit is the new principal of Cleveland Street School, which will relocate to Our Lady of the Valley School (OLV) during the addition, and renovation of the school, for approximately two and a half years. Mr. Pettit is well familiar with the facility, as he oversaw the housing of Lincoln Avenue School at OLV, while Lincoln was under construction.

Forest Street School is now Forest Street Community School, joining Rosa Parks, Oakwood Avenue and Orange Preparatory Academy in the districts push to make all its schools a community school,

Ms. April Stokes is the newly appointed Assistant Principal, supporting Park Avenue School. Rosa Parks Community School welcomes new administrator, Assistant Principal Suzanne Carbone.

During August, school administrators reached out to their student population with a back to school message and information package. School families are asked to return all required documents to school by the requested dates. Additionally, school supply lists are posted on the individual school websites and for STEM Academy on the district website.

Additionally, each school has scheduled a Back-to-School-Night (BTSN). Parents and guardians will have the opportunity to meet their children's teachers, the school principal and administrative team, and receive valuable information about available programs and services offered at the school and in the district. This is also a chance for parents to get a preview of their child's daily life at school. They will learn about student expectations, the curriculum and how they can get involved in their school's parent organizations. See below for the BTSN schedule.

2018-2019 Superintendent's Forum

On September 4, the Orange Public School District opened the 2018-2019 school year with the annual Superintendent's Forum, presented by Interim Superintendent of Schools Ronald C. Lee. The program opened with the playing of "Stand for Something," by Andra Day, followed by a moving and inspiring recitation of "Let America Be America Again," by Langston Hughes, by second grader Ikenna Obikulu, from Rosa Parks Community School (*pictured right*). He eagerly delved into his school's pledge, after thunderous applause, before the audience joined him in the flag salute.



Deputy Superintendent Dr. Paula Howard gave warm opening remarks before introducing Interim Superintendent Lee. Mr. Lee welcomed

over 890 new and returning staff members to their first day of school for staff. He informed staff of school and administrative team changes before his presentation.

Guest speakers included the Orange Board of Education President E. Lydell Carter, the Honorable Mayor Dwayne D. Warren, Esq., the Orange Administrators and Supervisors Association President Faith Alcantara, and Vice President of the Orange Education Association Lisa Catanzarite. All touted the accomplishments and support for the district's efforts and the collaboration that exists between the township, students and staff to create an environment for learning and student success.



Interim Superintendent Lee's presentation crystalized his brand message this year - Orange Public Schools, Where We Do Great Things. The tag-line, emblemized on the shirts distributed to staff and featured on the billboards highlight some of the accomplishments for the past school year and shown in a video which played as the audience gathered and was seated.

Mr. Lee reviewed enrollment, financials, facilities plans, including the construction and renovation plans for Cleveland Street School and Orange High School and the PARCC attainment, as compared to the following 2017-2018 Goal:

By June 2019, the Orange Board of Education will enhance and improve student achievement for all students, as measured by a minimum 20 percentage point increase on the PARCC assessments in Mathematics and English Language Arts per grade over the 2017 baseline. (10 percentage points in 2018 and 10 percentage points in 2019)

Mr. Lee presented checks to Forest Street School for exceeding PARCC state average for Grade 5&6 ELA, Orange Preparatory Academy for exceeding state average for Algebra II, and the STEM Academy for exceeding state average for geometry. Checks are to be used for school related activities. Principals were called to the stage for schools meeting various other aspects of the goal and presented with certificates.

This year Mr. Lee devised overall school growth points for PARCC attainment and first place went to Rosa Parks Community School and second place went to Forest Street Community School.

Teachers that achieved the Highest Student Growth Percentile (SGP) for the 2016-2017 school year, as determined by data received from the New Jersey Department of Education's NJSMART system, were acknowledged for their achievement. They received checks to be used for their classrooms. A \$1,500 check was also presented to the top school with the highest SGP for 2016-2017, Forest Street Community School.

Mr. Lee presented Orange High School AP Results, which has steadily improved over the past four years, and highlighted the attainment, sharing a picture of the billboard indicating that the AP calculus exam had a 95% pass rate. He called to the stage, teacher Mr. Hooman Behzadpour to accept a \$1,000 classroom check for his noted accomplishment.

The Employee of the year recognition was presented with a tribute sung by STEM Academy student Cassandra Dawson, accompanied by Voices in Harmony singers and music teacher Mr. Charles Postas. She sang "Teacher on Fire" rewritten by Heywood Avenue music teacher, Mrs. Erin-Leigh VanOrden. The performance was also supported with a slide presentation of district teachers and staff.

The Orange Public School District Early Childhood Program has scheduled registration for the 2018-2019 school year for the following dates: Tuesdays, September 11, 18, and 25, from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., with the last sign-in at 12:00 p.m., at the Orange Early Childhood Center (OECC), located at 397 Park Avenue in Orange.

The Orange Board of Education provides a full day preschool education for all three and four year old residents of Orange. There is no fee for the school

day (8:30 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.).

The registration requirements are:

- 3 or 4 years old by 10/01/18
- Must be resident of Orange Township
- Original Birth Certificate
- Child's Immunization Record
- Current Lease or Mortgage Statement (Note: If you are living with a friend or relative, you must be included in their lease agreement. Notarized letters stating you rent a room/apartment/house will not be accepted.)
- 2 Current Proofs of Residency (i.e. PSE&G bill, telephone or cable bill)
- Picture ID of the Parent

Additionally, the Orange Early Childhood Program includes all children regardless of abilities. If parents are concerned about how their preschool child is developing or learning differently, they can call the district to request an evaluation for preschool special education and related services.
