They gave an independent auditor's report, highlighting that there were no audit recommendations for the school district. This confirmed that the district maintains sound financial practices.



Next, Mr. Reggie Miller (pictured left), Program Director for the Male Student Support Program (MSSP) gave his Annual Report. He

outlined the group's community service activities, including a Thanksgiving Canned Food Drive and a Christmas Toy Drive, and detailed some of the topics covered in their mentoring sessions, such as public speaking, health and safety concerns and gang awareness. The participating schools, during the first part of the school year, were Park Avenue School, Forest Street School and Oakwood Avenue Community School




