Education Builds A Stronger Community

On September 1, Superintendent of Schools, Mr. Ronald C. Lee, welcomed staff to the 2016-2017 school year at the annual Superintendent's Forum. After marshaling personnel and appealing to staff, the aisles were cleared for the opening performance, which thrilled the audience! Rosa Parks Community School performed portions of the school's production of *Lion King Kids*. The students, under the direction of the of Visual and Performing Arts teachers, Nadiyah Smith-McCoy, Mariel Johnson, Aggie Wsolkowski,

Veronica Barahona and other valued Rosa Parks staff, didn't skip a beat. They were flawless, singing several iconic tunes from the classic Disney musical including *Hakuna Matata*. Lydell Carter, as well as remarks by the President of the Orange Education Association, Ms. Linda Siddiq and the President of the Orange Administrator's and Supervisor's Association, Ms. Faith Alcantara. All gave insightful comments on the direction of the school district and expressed enthusiasm for a successful school year.

Mr. Joseph Zarra, Interim Executive County Superintendent was pleased to be invited to the forum and welcomed the opportunity to address the audience with praise for the good work and progress made in the district.

Principal Dr. Myron Hackett and Physical Education teacher Mr. Peter Naumowicz chaperoned the trip to the Nationals.

The team's coach is Dr. Denise Harlem, Park Avenue's Technology Coordinator.

He reviewed district strategic goals to be achieved by 2021. He also discussed student enrollment, *Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC*) test scores, the preliminary report on the district's graduation rate, which has grown to 93.3% in 2016 and the increase in the numbers of students passing the AP exam. While celebrating district achievements, he acknowledged that we are still not where we want to be with PARCC attainment, however, he indicated, "We are closing the gap."

Superintendent Lee shared additional district highlights and accomplishments, as well as a video presentation of the Robotics Summer program conducted by the Math and Science Department. He also reviewed a letter distributed to staff regarding the evaluation model for teachers and principals.

Dr. Paula Howard presented Curriculum and Instruction goals for 2016-2017. Areas of focus are: Building Knowledge, Developing Conceptual Understanding and Promoting 21st Century Learning.



After the year in review segment of the his presentation,
Superintendent Lee (pictured left) delighted the audience with a
wardrobe change and the backstory to his decision to wear his orange
jacket. He shared the story behind its purchase, his reluctance to wear
it, seeing a similar jacket on one of his wife's favorite entertainers, and
finally unwrapping it on stage. He was heartily encouraged by the
audience, made the change and conducted the remainder of the forum
in the "new" jacket.

With the overview completed, Superintendent Lee celebrated staff with the annual awards presentation.
