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The Annual Superintendent's Forum, Part II



The September 1 Superintendent's Forum was an enjoyable, as well as informative celebration of district achievement, student and staff recognition and school accomplishments. The meeting also communicated objectives outlined in the district's Strategic Plan 2014-2021 and imparted key initiatives that the district will pursue during the 2015-2016 school year.

Three objectives, to be accomplished over the next six years, are:

Objective 1: By the year 2021, Orange Public School students will achieve academic proficiency in 21st Century skills, readying them for college and career.

Objective 2: By 2021, Orange Public Schools will increase community engagement and outreach.

Objective 3: By the year 2021, Orange Public Schools will seek and provide the resources necessary to create additional instruction space that will allow for the restructuring of grades and expansion of program offerings, empowering all learners to achieve 21st century learning success.

Key district initiatives for 2015-2016 are:

- All schools must establish a functioning male and female mentoring groups for students in grades 4-12
- The district is seeking to expand and improve services to students and families to address emotional, behavioral, mental health and psychological issues
- The expansion of STEM programs, opportunities and experiences for students
- Expansion of the Communities Schools model to "The Prep" with services to OHS
- Developing an Annual Report about the district and mailing them to all residents of Orange.

Owizdom Winners

Before the event concluded, Superintendent Lee further entertained the staff with The Orange Public Schools Game Show. He utilized Qwisdom Virtual Response (QVR) system with an Audience Response App to allow the staff members to participate in a question and answer game. There were over 300 participants. The Audience Response app transformed smartphones and other smart devices into a response tool to answer multiple-choice questions relating to testing acronyms, teacher measurement tools and brainteasers. The top eight winners were brought to the stage to receive prize money for their schools.
