12 Angry Men

The dramatic production, 12 Angry Men, presented December 3 - 5 at Orange Preparatory Academy, showed the depth of the student performers in the classic 1950s play about a jury trial that seems like and an open and shut case until one juror questions the strength of a guilty verdict. Through his probing and the ensuing conflicts with other members of the jury, one by one, jurors are convinced that there is "reasonable doubt" that the 19 year old defendant committed murder.

Director, Dana Levin, drama teacher at Orange High School, successfully recast the 12 jurors, originally conceived as 12 men from varying backgrounds, as a mixed gender ensemble. "I knew what I wanted to concentrate on, what I wanted to emphasize and what needed to be changed," she stated. Ms. Levin complimented the students for their hard work and talent.

Orange Public Schools Host Winter Dance Intensive

The Orange Public School District is pleased to welcome dancers, young and old, to the Orange Winter Dance Intensive, which will be held over a two-day period during the district's Holiday Recess, December 28 - 29, at Park Avenue School.



Several prominent Master Teachers will be on hand to work with the dancers during the Winter Intensive. Notable instructors include Robert Alexander, Master Ballet Teacher (Ailey School, Dance Theatre of Harlem, and Harlem School of the Arts); Maleek Washington, Contemporary and Improv Movement (Abraham in Motion); Keenan Cooks, Hip Hop (Broadway Dance Center); Joanna Numata, Hip Hop (Broadway Dance Center); and Ebony Williams, Contemporary Ballet and Audition Prep (Beyonce's Made in America Tour, Cedar Lake Contemporary Ballet). Many other top dance educators, from the tri-state area, will also be on hand to lead dancers through classes in ballet, tap, jazz, hip hop, African, musical theatre, modern, contemporary dance, as well as acting for dancers and stage makeup.

"We are exceedingly lucky to have such talented and dedicated dance instructors here to work with our young people," stated Deborah Rembert, Coordinator of the Winter Dance Intensive and Director of the Orange Dance Conservatory. "And beyond that, I am fortunate to be able to plan these types of educational experiences for our students. We thank our Superintendent, Mr. Ronald C. Lee, for being such an advocate of Arts Education. We owe him our gratitude, along with our new Visual and Performing Arts Supervisor, Ms. Donna Sinisgalli, who has embraced our Orange Dance Conservatory."

The Orange Winter Dance Intensive will be held at Park Avenue School, at 231 Park Avenue, Orange, NJ, on Monday, December 28th and Tuesday, December 29th from 8:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. The cost is \$40 for one day and \$65 for two days, per student. The intensive is open to all dance studios, dance schools, youth programs, college dance students, public and private school dance programs and any lover of dance in our communities (including adults). Groups will be divided by age: 8-10 (juniors), 11-13 (teens), 14 and up (seniors). Two healthy snacks and water will be provided, but attendees should bring a lunch. Rosa Parks Students Register for John Hopkins University's Center for Talented Youth Program (CTY).

Selected students of Rosa Parks Community School, from grades 5, 6, and 7, have been enrolled in a Talent Search program offered by the Center for Talented Youth (CTY), a division of John Hopkins University, Baltimore, Maryland. Through the CTY programs, students are given an opportunity to excel in Math and Language Arts, outside of the school curriculum. Based on SCAT (School College Ability Test) scores, students get a great opportunity to be qualified for a three week fully paid summer course in the areas of Math, Science, writing, and other interesting subjects.

Math interventionist, Mrs.Hanife Yildiz and ESL teacher, Mr.Selliah Gnanaseharan volunteered to assist Rosa Parks's students by providing information about the CTY programs, enrolling them, and scheduling them for testing. More than 30 students have shown interest and have already been enrolled in the program.

OHS Participates in Hour of Code

During the week of December 7-13, Orange High School participated in the *Hour of Code*, which takes place each year during Computer Science Education Week. The *Hour of Code* is a one-hour introduction to computer science, designed to make coding easier to understand and to show that anyone can learn the basics.

Students in Mr. Max Nixon's SmartLab and Introduction to Engineering classes participated in this global movement that reached tens of millions of students in 180+ countries. Some students, who are English Language Learners (ELL), followed tutorials in their native language. Tutorials (through *Hour of Code* resources) were available in over 40 languages.

"My belief is that all students should have the opportunity to learn computer science and this exposure is vital in a SmartLab environment," said Mr. Nixon. "It helps to nurture problem-solving skills, logic and creativity, which is what STEM is all about."


