Mr. Brian Silvoy directed vocal music students, organized by grades, singing delightful tunes for the audience. Ms. Jackson and Ms. McConnell's 1st grade classes sang *Sounds of the Night*, among several other songs. Ms. Copeland and Ms. Smith's 2nd grades had *It's a Celebration*, as part of their selections. Ms. Bateman's 6th grade and Ms. O'Connor's 5th grade joined forces to perform such songs as *Peace in 12 Languages* and *Peace on Earth*.

Cleveland's new drama instructor, Ms. Britt Keshner, introduced students in Ms. Baguidy and Ms. Sabol's Kindergarten classes reciting poetry. They performed *Sick* by Shel Silverstein and *High Five* from *They Might be Giants*. The students were well prepared for their recitation and truly entertained the audience. Next she presented an original play *Alice in Winterland*, with lead character Alice the Ice Queen and the Snow Leopard, where Alice is taken from her classroom to Winterland and the Ice Queen's Winter Castle. The students performed enthusiastically and enjoyed their roles.

Orange Winter Dance Intensive



The Orange Winter Dance Intensive will be held at Park Avenue School, at 231 Park Avenue, Orange, on Monday, December 28th and Tuesday, December 29th from 8:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. The cost is \$40 for one day and \$65 for two days, per student. The intensive is open to all dance studios, dance schools, youth programs, college dance students, public and private school dance programs and any lover of dance in our communities (including adults). Groups will be divided by age: 8-10 (juniors), 11-13 (teens), 14 and up (seniors). Two healthy snacks and water will be provided, but attendees should bring a lunch. Gatorade and additional snacks

Several prominent Master Teachers will be on hand to work with the dancers during the Winter Intensive. Notable instructors include Robert Alexander, Master Ballet Teacher (Ailey School, Dance Theatre of Harlem, and Harlem School of the Arts); Maleek Washington, Contemporary and Improv Movement (Abraham in Motion); Keenan Cooks, Hip Hop (Broadway Dance Center); Joanna Numata, Hip Hop (Broadway Dance Center); and Ebony Williams, Contemporary Ballet and Audition Prep (Beyonce's Made in America Tour, Cedar Lake Contemporary Ballet). Many other top dance educators, from the tri-state area, will also be on hand to lead dancers through classes in ballet, tap, jazz, hip hop, African, musical theatre, modern, contemporary dance, as well as acting for dancers and stage makeup.


