I hope this communication finds you well. Additionally, I am hopeful each of you are in great health and spirit. We had yet another exciting week within the Orange Public School District.



PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT DAY: IN THE EFFORT OF PROVIDING TARGETED AND INTENTIONAL PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT WIDE, REVIEW OF WALK THROUGH TRENDS, AS WELL AS DISCUSSION VIA COMMON PLANNING MEETINGS, WERE THE INDICATORS THAT PROPELLED THE CATALOGUE OF INSTRUCTIONAL SESSIONS. DISTRICT MATH TEACHERS PARTICIPATED IN TRAINING FOCUSED ON ANALYZING DIAGNOSTIC DATA AND EXPLORING RESEARCH-BASED STRATEGIES THEY COULD IMPLEMENT IN THE CLASSROOM. THE SCIENCE TEACHERS ENGAGED IN ANALYZING DATA AND CONTINUED TO LEARN ABOUT THREE-DIMENSIONAL LEARNING STRATEGIES AND TECHNIQUES.

THE WORLD LANGUAGE TEAM REVIEWED INFORMATION TO SUPPORT LESSON PLANNING, AND DISCUSSED DIFFERENTIATED INSTRUCTIONAL PRACTICES AND HOW THEY CAN BE IMPLEMENTED IN THE CLASSROOM. SECOND GRADE ENGLISH/LANGUAGE ARTS TEACHERS WERE ENGAGED IN READING A PROFESSIONAL TEXT AND DISCUSSION DURING THEIR PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT SESSION TITLED "THE POWER OF ORAL LANGUAGE AND ITS IMPORTANCE TO WRITING DEVELOPMENT." THE OFFICE OF INNOVATION AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT TEAM MEMBERS ENGAGED IN AN ARRAY OF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT SESSIONS.

THE DISTRICT TECHNOLOGY COORDINATORS PARTICIPATED IN COMPUTER LITERACY TRAINING, THE CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE) TEAM REVIEWED BEST PRACTICES ON PRESENTATION SKILLS IN CTE, AND THE COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT TEAM FOCUSED ON FUNDRAISING INITIATIVES, DEVELOPING COMMUNITY ADVISORY BOARDS AND BEST PRACTICES IN TECHNOLOGY. THESE ARE SAMPLES OF WHAT OCCURRED ON THE DAY OF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT. AS ALWAYS, INSTRUCTIONAL SESSIONS OCCUR DAILY AT THE SCHOOL AND DISTRICT LEVEL.

RED RIBBON WEEK: OCTOBER 23-31, 2023, THE ORANGE PUBLIC SCHOOLS WILL OBSERVE RED RIBBON WEEK. WHAT IS RED RIBBON WEEK? RED RIBBON WEEK IS AN ALCOHOL, TOBACCO, SMOKING, AND OTHER DRUG AND VIOLENCE PREVENTION AWARENESS CAMPAIGN OBSERVED ANNUALLY IN OCTOBER IN THE UNITED STATES. IT BEGAN AS A TRIBUTE TO FALLEN DRUG ENFORCEMENT AGENCY (DEA) SPECIAL AGENT ENRIQUE CAMERENA IN 1985. ACCORDING TO THE UNITED STATES DEA, RED RIBBON WEEK IS THE NATION'S LARGEST AND LONGEST-RUNNING DRUG AWARENESS AND PREVENTION PROGRAM.

**Monday** (Wear Red Day): School counselors and teachers will discuss the theme of this year's Red Ribbon Week. Students will sign a Drug Free Pledge. Pledges will be displayed in the hallways by the classroom. Parent Pledge is sent home to be signed and displayed at home. Staff and students wear red tops or dress to school.

Tuesday (Sock it to Drugs): Students and staff wear red socks to school.

Wednesday (Hands off Drugs): Students trace their hands and print their names on the construction paper cutouts. The cutouts are pasted on a bulletin board paper to be displayed on the classroom doors or hallways.

**Thursday** (**Be a Hero, not a Zero**): Homeroom teachers will facilitate discussions on setting academic goals. **Grade 3-4 students** will name and illustrate what they want to grow up to be on a piece of paper, and tape or glue it inside the front cover of their favorite notebook. Grades **5-7 students** will write a paragraph describing their career goals on a piece of paper, and tape or glue it inside the front cover of their favorite notebook.

Friday (School Pride Day): Students and staff wear the school purple or gold T-shirts to show school pride.

Monday (Put a Cap on Drugs): Students wear a cap to school.

Tuesday (Say Boo to Drugs): Students wear a costume during the last block of school.



## SUPERINTENDENT'S ACADEMIC CORNER

AS A DISTRICT, WE ARE PUSHING PEDAGOGICALLY FORWARD TO ENSURE THAT INTENTIONAL AND RIGOROUS INSTRUCTION IS TAKING PLACE. WEEKLY, WE SHARE INSTRUCTIONAL STRATEGIES TO ASSIST IN THIS AREA. THIS WEEK, WE WILL DELVE A BIT INTO SOCRATIC SEMINAR. THIS STRATEGY IS USED PRIMARILY IN MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL GRADE LEVELS. WITH REGARDS TO HIGHER ORDER THINKING SOCRATIC SEMINARS RANK WITHIN THE HIGHER TIERS OF BLOOM'S TAXONOMY. FURTHERMORE, THIS INSTRUCTIONAL PRACTICE LENDS ITSELF TO THE STRATEGIC THINKING ANCHOR WITHIN WEBB'S DEPTH OF KNOWLEDGE.

MANY TEACHERS WE KNOW HAVE REMARKED THAT INDIVIDUAL AND COLLECTIVE INSIGHTS AND EXPERIENCES FROM SOCRATIC SEMINARS ARE THE MOMENTS THAT MOST IMPACT STUDENTS, THE MOMENTS THEY REMEMBER MOST POIGNANTLY.

SIMPLY PUT, THE SOCRATIC METHOD IS AN ONGOING DIALOGUE THAT USES QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS TO GRADUALLY ELIMINATE HYPOTHESES. GRANT WIGGINS OFFERED A DEFINITION FOR THE SOCRATIC SEMINAR - SOMETHING HE WOULD ALSO CALL SIMPLY A 'SEMINAR':

"A SEMINAR IS A QUESTION-FOCUSED, STUDENT-LED, AND TEACHER-FACILITATED DISCUSSION, BASED ON APPROPRIATE TEXTS. SOMETIMES WE CALL THIS ACTIVITY A 'SOCRATIC SEMINAR'-AFTER SOCRATES, WELL KNOWN FOR HIS OPEN-ENDED DIALOGUES. SOMETIMES WE CALL IT A 'CLASS DISCUSSION' TO SIGNAL THAT THE CLASS WILL DISCUSS, WITH THE TEACHER PLAYING A MODERATOR ROLE. WHATEVER WE CALL IT, A SEMINAR IS DIFFERENT FROM A TALK/RECITATION/ LECTURE-WITH-DISCUSSION. THE GOAL IS NOT THE ACQUISITION OF KNOWLEDGE VIA THE EXPERT; THE AIM IS STUDENT UNDERSTANDING VIA ACTIVE THINKING OUT LOUD AND PROBING OF IDEAS BY ALL STUDENTS."

THE ULTIMATE GOAL OF USING THE SOCRATIC METHOD IS TO FOSTER CRITICAL THINKING BY EXAMINING ONE'S INACCURATE OR INCOMPLETE BELIEFS, AND THE BIASES, BLIND SPOTS, AND ASSUMPTIONS THAT LEAD TO THEM. IDEALLY, A STUDENT WILL EMERGE FROM A SOCRATIC SEMINAR WITH GREATER CLARITY AND DEPTH OF THEIR OWN UNDERSTANDING. EMPATHY IS ANOTHER BENEFIT THAT TEACHERS OFTEN NOTICE WHEN STUDENTS SHOW RESPECT FOR ONE ANOTHER BY LISTENING ACTIVELY, ACKNOWLEDGING ONE ANOTHER'S INPUT, AND SHARING DIVERSE PERSPECTIVES.
