BOARD COMMENTS

- Roll call was performed by Mr. James at 7:18pm followed by the Pledge of Allegiance by a student of Oakwood Ave. Community School and a brief video presentation.
- Ms. Harper rendered the HIB presentation to the public.
- Mr. Lee rendered the Superintendent's Report for the month. He specifically reported on the Superintendent's Forum, which took place on September 1, 2017, and key achievement goals set and the NJROTC (Cadet) Program in the District. Mr. Lee also reported that the STEM School could not be opened on September 11, 2017 as planned because of some delays relating to renovation and approval of C of O. He said the STEM program is a partnership with NJIT where graduating students will obtain 40 college credits. The program will not be opened on September 18, 2017 for the same reasons mentioned above.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

- Patricia Arthur informed the board/public that she attended the City Council meeting last Tuesday night, stating two things in the agenda which include: a) filing a petition for the November election changing from Type I to Type II and b) on second reading, Council deferred voting on the bond to the subsequent meeting. She expressed dismay at council members who demonstrated a lack of interest in the children of Orange. She said two people trying to get on the District's board asked that the Council vote no on the bond. She asked the board president to attend the council meeting. Mr. Lee responded to some of Ms. Arthur's comments.
- Marilyn, a neighbor to OHS, said she isn't fond of the idea that parking will be in her neighborhood. She said she has serious concern with the plan.
- Gloria Stewart said parking in the District has always been a problem. She
 expressed support for Mr. Lee that we should all join together for things that will
 benefit the children. She referred to a resolution, F17-055, for clarification and
 expressed happiness for the Superintendent's Forum. She suggested railings be
 put on the OPA stage for safety reasons. She also suggested character building
 as it pertains to the HIB presentation.
- William Hardaway thanked the City of Orange for the back pack for back to school night and the help to the community. He thanked the Mayor's office and the community for their efforts. Mr. Hardaway also shared thanks for the donation made to the Orange Football Program.

• Tyrone Tarver spoke on the petition brought up in the Council Meeting. He said there is no requirement to change the school board. He indicated that the citizen of Orange requested the petition, because many signed to request the petition for changes from Type I to Type II. Regarding the bond, he said many citizens are concerned about the bond. Mr. Lee said the District submitted a plan for the bond, as against Mr. Tarver's claim that no plan was submitted. He said he is concerned about the level of debt the City of Orange School District is carrying. Mr. Lee offered some explanations to correct Mr. Tarver's claim that the District is carrying too much debt.

PUBLIC COMMENTS REOPENED

- Gloria Stewart requested the rationale for the appointment of Schwartz & Edelstein per resolution G17-028. She also said that the citizens voted that they wanted an elected board, stating that the board should be transparent in their dealings.
- Marilyn said the board should be prudent and not spend money on hiring lawyers.
- Tyrone Tarver commented on the 4 year statute saying that the 4 year rule does not apply.
- Ms. Kyleesha Hill explained that the hiring of Edelstein is to assess the legality of the petition and nothing else.
- Derrick Henry referred to the judge's ruling of November 2016 and said there was no undue burden in respect of challenging the case.
- Mr. Hunt reiterated that before the case can be challenged a 4 year period has to lapse.
