PUBLIC COMMENTS

- Walter (Press Man) expressed appreciation for the Black History Month. He said back in the 1960's there was no teaching curriculum, but teachers improvised. He said he benefited in the education of those days.
- Tyrone Tarver (Parent) distributed papers to the board and read through the document. He would like to know the OBOE's involvement in the upcoming board election. (See Attached) Mr. Carter (Board President) addressed the issues raised about the Board's participation in the upcoming board election.
- Patricia Arthur corrected Mr. Tarver that during the last election, members of the public were educated through a public forum and provided with written materials relating to the election.

- A parent of a student at Rosa Parks asked why Rosa Parks students were not allowed to go out for recess outside. She wants to know the BOE plan regarding renovation of the playground and students having recess outside. Dear Mr. James:

Because of the conflicting city council meeting, I am unable to attend Tuesday's BOE Regular Meeting. Consequently, I respectfully request that this letter be distributed to all BOE members and that the following comments and questions be inserted into the official January 9, 2018 BOE public record.

Civics matter. I do not believe in coincidences. One year ago, President Barack Obama delivered his Farewell Address to the Nation. In hindsight, this Farewell Address was historic and prophetic. It ranks with President George Washington's farewell warning to steer clear of permanent foreign alliances. It ranks with President Dwight Eisenhower's farewell warning of the industrial military complex. Indeed, President Obama delivered his remarks before the phrase "alternative facts" entered our lexicon.

On January 10, 2017, President Obama set forth his belief and commitment to our constitutional form of democratic participatory government. President Obama reminded us:

[D]emocracy does not require uniformity. Our founders quarreled and compromised, and expected us to do the same. But they knew that democracy does require a basic sense of solidarity-the idea that for all our outward differences, we are all in this together, that we rise or fall as one.

Politics is a battle of ideas; in the course of a healthy debate, we'll prioritize different goals, and the different means of reaching them. But without some common baseline of facts; without a willingness to admit new information, and concede that your opponent is making a fair point,

and that science and reason matter, we'll keep talking past each other, making common ground and compromise impossible. . . .

It falls to each of us to be those anxious, jealous guardians of our democracy; to embrace the joyous task we've been given to continually try to improve this great nation of ours. Because for all our outward differences, we all share the same proud title: Citizen.

Accordingly, in the context of President Obama's Farewell Remarks and the Cancelled January 4, 2018 Special Meeting on Limited and Shortened Notice, I respectfully request real time responses to the following pertinent questions.

- 1. When will the BOE begin to post its meetings agendas 48 hours prior to its regular and special meetings?
- 2. When will the BOE begin to post its annual audits on its public website?
- 3. Who opined as to the validity of the December 30, 2017 Special Meeting "Other Matters" Public E-Mail Blast Notice under State law?
- 4. What were these "Other Matters" described in the December 30, 2017 Special Meeting E-Mail Blast?
- 5. Who opined as to the validity of the amending resolution restricting the aggregate amount of public comments to three minutes under State law?
- 6. Did counsel compare the public comment policies and procedures in Summit, Millburn and Livingston?
- 7. Why aren't BOE regular meetings broadcasted, recorded and rebroadcasted on the City's public access channel?
- 8. Where in the BOE's June 30, 2017 Audit Report are the three Orange Educational Foundation Leases disclosed?
- 9. Where in the BOE's June 30, 2017 Audit is the STEM Academy Lease disclosed?
- 10. Why does the BOE's June 30, 2017 Audit footnote regarding the impact of long term tax exemptions conflict with the City's CY 2016 Audit footnote?
- 11. Are the BOE regular meeting audio tapes "governmental records" under the Open Public Records Act and subject to production pursuant to OPRA? See, Libertarians for Transparent Government v. The Ocean County Prosecutor's Office, A-1608-16T1 (App. Div. Jan. 4, 2018) (Judges Messano, Accurso and Vernoia remanding to the trial court to assess whether the record custodian conducted required search for the requested records)
- 12. Under what authority did the former BOE attorney execute and bind the BOE on the Orange Educational Foundation Park Avenue Lease?
- 13. What is the updated status of the STEM Academy located in South Orange?
- 14. Who dropped the ball and delayed the special BOE II election from January to March?
- 15. Does an appointed BOE have the statutory and moral authority to shift all BOE elections from April to November after the distribution of the March 2017 special election petitions?
- 16. In its BOE II Monetary Sanctions Objection, did the BOE negligently, recklessly and intentionally conceal certain material procedural facts from the Court?

- 17. Will reliance on a sparse legal memorandum containing no case law analysis by a deputy city attorney shield the BOE, its members and counsel from monetary sanctions?
- 18. As fiduciaries of a public trust, are all BOE "public servants" subject to the equitable remedy of disgorgement? See, Editorial: "Clawback a Just Penalty for Employee Disloyalty," New Jersey Law Journal, 223 N.J.L.J. 3826 (Dec. 25, 2017) ("Economically harmed or not, an employer who is victimized by a dishonorable employee should have the right to recapture compensation paid during the time of the employee's disloyalty. A dishonest employee should not be allowed to go unpunished because of the fortuity of his employer's lack of loss. The integrity of our marketplace demands a full panoply of remedies for judges.")

Re: Questions presented at the Orange BOE School Board Monthly Meeting

This letter is to inquire about certain actions by the Orange School board that I have concerns about.

- 1) I was made aware that the School Board has been involved in the planning stages of upcoming School Board forums. I believe that is illegal for a School board or any Public Agency to be involved in any activities concerning candidates running for Public position. I would like to know the BOE and/or School Board's involvement in the planning stages of these upcoming forums.
- 2) Concerning the Orange BOE's recent outreach to candidates. A letter was sent to myself requesting that I submit a Bio and Photo for distribution throughout the School District. I believe that this action may be in violation of State law. I believe that it might be illegal to use Public Funds or Public Resources by any Public Agency to distribute any information concerning candidate(s) running for Public office. I have notified the Essex County Clerk and the Superintendent of Elections. I have also been instructed to notify the Essex County Superintendent, the Attorney General and Prosecutor's offices.
- 3) I have not seen any resolution on the BOE Meeting Agenda made available yesterday on the Orange BOE website that authorizes the Business Office to use Public Funds and/or resources to distribute candidate information regarding the March 13, 2018 Special School Board election. I would like to know when this was decided and if the Board Members were notified of this and why is this not being publicly voted on tonight, if not added to the agenda already?
- 4) I was contacted today by the Business Administrator's office concerning participation in two upcoming School Board forums. I have also been informed via email by the Business Administrator's office that Lincoln Avenue School will be the venue for a Candidates forum hosted by the NAACP. Again, I am concerned that it might be illegal to use Public Funds and/or resources to contribute to any candidate events unless being reimbursed by the Parties that will host the events. I would like the details to be made public at this School Board meeting concerning the Orange Public School's role in this event and the details concerning Lincoln Avenue School being used as the venue.
- 5) As of yesterday, I did not see any resolution concerning the use of Lincoln Avenue School for use as a venue for a privately hosted School Election Candidates forum.
- 6) The February 13, 2018 Agenda was not posted on the Orange Public School's website until yesterday at 3:57pm. Not posting an agenda forty-eight (48) business hours prior to a public meeting is in violation of the Open Public Meetings Act, that this School Board adheres to and is

- stated clearly at the top of all agendas distributed before every School Board Meeting. I have been asking about this publicly since Spring of 2016. I would like to know why Agendas are still not being made available forty-eight (48) business hours prior to School Board meetings, as required by law.
- 7) I was made aware of the BOE's response to a letter submitted by Jeffrey Feld at last month's January 2018 School Board meeting. In this response to Mr. Feld, he asked the attendees of the May 2017 School board Retreat. I noticed that my name was not included as one of the attendees. I also noticed that Assistant Superintendent Dr. Paula Howard and School Board member Dr. Courtne Thomas' names were also omitted. I would like this response to Mr. Feld to be amended to reflect all twelve (12) attendees at the meeting and for this amended response to be attached to January's meeting minutes.
