BOARD COMMENTS

- Roll Call was performed by Mr. James at 7:40 pm followed by the Flag Salute by students of the OECC and a short presentation. Awards and recognition were bestowed on Students of the Month.

- Mr. Sherif suggested rotating board meetings to different schools to improve public attendance. Mr. Lee said the issue of low attendance was discussed recently and ways to improve attendance would be sought.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

- Mrs. Patricia Arthur commented about parents attending board meetings, saying rotation had been done in the past and that it will not make any difference. She suggested that PTO meetings can be blended with board meetings. She commended Ms. Sacks Teen Summit and also said taking away certain activities that parents/students like (sports, etc.) may improve attendance.
- Gloria Stewart congratulated newly elected board members and expressed disappointment at board member's attendance. She talked about the professional development and that Mr. Lee should reach out to the OPD to stop them from issuing tickets during professional development. She commended Mr. James for the move of TCU's at Oakwood. She said Mr. James was somehow too technical for her understanding. She observed that board members are on the agenda so

that the public knows how they are voting and what they are voting on. She asked whether the City can come to assess the condition of trees at Heywood.

 Derrick Henry expressed happiness and honor to be elected on the board and said he will be working for the good of the people.
