Early Learning Transitional Program: A summer program for students who are in pre-K for whom English is a second language or who have only had one year of prethe cognitive, health and social outcomes for eligible school will be held to improve children. The program is designed to prepare the children with the prerequisite skills and dispositions for learning that will enable them to benefit in kindergarten experiences. Additionally, there will be a program for K-2 students that incorporates literacy foundation skills and standards as well as utilizing literacy skills in games projects. The programs will be held in July and early August.

Social Emotional Learning: A "bridge program" for students who are transitioning from grade 7 to grade 8, grade 8 to grade 9, and grade 9 to grade 10 is available for students to enhance school improvement efforts to provide evidence based interventions that will improve targeted outcomes in social climate and safety, academic achievement and attainment, disciplinary outcomes, and civic behaviors and attitudes. Additionally, a program for elementary port-of-entry students will occur for students who have been in the US less than one year.

STEM Curriculum: Project Lead the Way (PLTW) is part of the STEM curriculum in three of the seven elementary schools. Students in the other schools will have access to PLTW during this summer program. The program provides the content and practices of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics to construct evidence-based explanations for how a phenomenon occurs or to solve human needs.
