PLTW programs create a stimulating learning environment and prepare teachers to engage their students in hands-on experiences that allow them to become immersed in real-world learning. Research demonstrates that PLTW students outperform their peers in school, are better prepared for post-secondary studies, and are more likely to consider careers as scientists, technology experts, engineers, mathematicians, healthcare providers, and researchers compared to their non-PLTW peers. Starting PLTW Launch at a young age develops excitement about PLTW and STEM-related fields. More importantly, 31% of PLTW students study engineering compared to the 8% national average; and

WHEREAS, the District's long-term vision is to get students excited about math and science at an early age and eventually develop a larger pool of students who can filter into STEM-related fields; and

WHEREAS, the program components in PLTW Launch 4 will involve

Collisions: Students discover the relationship between the speed of an object and the energy of that object, as well as predict the transfer of energy as a result of a collision between two objects. The design problem is for students to they apply their knowledge and skills to develop a vehicle restraint system;

Conversions: Students identify and explain how energy can be converted to meet a human need or want. The design problem is to move donated food from a truck to a food pantry.

Computer Systems: In this exploration of how computers work, students investigate reaction time as a measure of nervous system function; how to diagnose concussions and create a reaction-time computer program to assess a baseline before a concussion occurs. Students apply what they have learned to build their own reaction-time measurement devices on tablets.

Human Brain: Students discover how signals passing from cell to cell allow us to receive stimuli from the outside world, transmit this information to the brain for processing, and then send out a signal to generate a response. Students work as part of a team to design, plan, and create a video or podcast to educate children on identifying and preventing concussions; and

WHEREAS, the program components in PLTW Launch 5 will involve

Robotics and Automation: Students explore a variety of robotic components as they build and test mobile robots that may be controlled remotely. They are tasked with designing a mobile robot that can remove hazardous materials from a disaster site. Robotics and Automation: Students expand their understanding of robotics as they explore mechanical design and computer programming. This module focuses on developing skills needed to build and program autonomous robots and are tasked with designing an automatic-guided vehicle to deliver supplies to a specific area in a hospital without being remotely controlled by a person.

Infection Detection: Students explore transmission of infection, agents of disease, and mechanisms the body uses to stay healthy. Students tackle the design problem by examining evidence to deduce the agent of infection, the likely source of the outbreak, and the path of transmission through a school.

Infection Modeling and Simulation: In this module, students investigate models and simulations and applying their new understandings to program their own models and collect data by running simulations with different parameters; and
