Superintendent's Report

Dr. Gerald Fitzhugh II, Superintendent of Schools

Dr. Gerald Fitzhugh updated the community about the new Orange Network and the dashboard and the Orange App giving up to date information. Mr. Jason Cordes will be co-presenting tonight.

Mr. Jason Cordes Reports on the Network:

It is my pleasure to present the New Comcast Channel. All components are in place. Tonight the board meeting is broadcasting from Comcast Channel 36. We are in the beginning stages but we hope to have 4 programmable slots 24 hours with direct communications with the community and parents.

We have a committee made up of staff and administrators. This began with Dr. Russo, and the late Mr. James and Mr. West the current IT manager. Dr. Gerald Fitzhugh reported:He acknowledges Black History Month and the importance of it. It was orginally call Negro History Week. It was first celebrated

1970 at Penn State. The 100 days of school is February 20, 2021 and will be celebrated at the winter break. The students will be part of the celebration.

Mr. Edwin Vasquez reported on the Facilities:

District Facility Maintenance & Custodial Services update: Staff disinfected all the buildings banisters, bathrooms and office getting ready for the students and staff to come back to the buildings. He is confident of its safety. In the heavy traffic areas we did additional cleaning.

Central School we had plumbing issues and we replace the pipes and changed the floors.

We converted the second bathroom to a closet and we continued painting throught the district. We cleaned the floor to make them look more welcoming. At STEM builing we had two of our systems go down, we repaired. There was a crack in our boiler and had to contract with Pensttra to repair. At OHS the water tank was coroted, we repaired. Pictures of te extension at OHS does not do it ant justice, its beautiful. He showed pictures of the 2nd floor and the roof. He rprted OHS now 3 brand new boilers.and pumps, new gym with new bleacher. OHS has a brand new roof. Cleveland school, in a few weeks we will begin to see the new extension be erated.

Dr. Gerald Fitzhugh: Thank Mr. Vasquez.

Reported on graffiti on the Oakwood avenue Community school, and he reported this is unacceptable. Reopening of school we are in phase 2 and we skip over phase 3 and go straight into phase 4 on March 1, 2021. We received over 2000 emails from parents opting out. He informed parents that it was not to late to opt in. They will have to wait 2 weeks after the marking cycle to schedule accordingly. We are practicing social distancing. We received our biometric scanners to scan everyone in every school building. Pictures will be posted.

Dr. Gerald Fitzhugh Superitnendent's Report

District Updates:

The district have given out over 120,000 meals. He thanked Mr. Dorsey for his work. Parent and Teacher conference parents please be reminded we need you there. He thanked the elementary staff for there work. He gave a special thank you to OHS and STEM the students able to see each other. They took an assessment. He thanked Ms. Tia Burnett and other staff. He thanked staff for the assistance with KIOSK. As of January 17th we have over \$2,000.000.00 in scholarships. Its 2.6 million dollars December 21st it was a 1.3 increase in scholarships. It was 3.2. OHS and 2.3 STEM Academy of the Orange. We received scholarships from Bloomfield College, Kean University, Citaterian University, Rider College and Seton Hall University. He thank all staff for their assistance.

Health and Safety:

Ms. Purkiss has been working with me with the dashboard which informs the district of slow formation for student who need to quarantine and at what schools. It informs positive covid cases and the location. This will be going live effective March 1, 2021. It is important to be transparent.

Guadalupe Cabido Reports Curriculum Committee Meeting:

These are competitive grants from the department of education which will give each recipient \$170,000 to help student loss. Which includes a four part intervention 2 mathmatics and 2 for ELA. These grants are targeted and a true team effort. Career Pathways a list of programs that is available for students. Extended Construction Responses (ECR) in mathematics, which this assessment items constructs major standards and indept response or symbolic responses, ECR assess student comprehension they provide rigor and allow for teachers to determine progress and plans for students success. ECR's are given to students on a monthly basis to special needs students and students ELL. Teacher follow s guidance questions. There is a certain protocol that they have to follow. Dr. Powell also resported on Capstone; students had to present indepth in front of a panel. Student in grades 9,10, 11 were assigned a questions were give only twenty minutes to upload

there work. Students defended their work and research. She was very impressed with the level presentation.

Dr. Gerald Fitzhugh reported on STEM Students:

On behalf of Dr. Powell he reported a select group students from STEM will be presenting their study to the NJ State Department of Education in the month of March. They will be going to Trenton.

Siaka Sharif reported on Finance Committee Meeting:

Finance committee meeting was held on February 4, 2021. It started at 5:45pm. The new board members and the new interim BA were welcomed. The budget calendar will be delayed to allow the new BA sometime. It will not be February 10th. At the finance committee meeting the discussion was on general ledger, district balance sheet, and treasurer report. The meeting was very nice. He reported on how the new BA discussed his plans and improvements for the future. Bell stadium was discussed and the activity that happens at bell stadium and how and when it is advertised; and how the district should be mentioned on the advertisement.
