#### OVERVIEW 2015 - 2016 BUDGET

Due to the current tight fiscal condition of the State of New Jersey, our District has been Flat-funded for the 2014-15 and 2015-16 school years.

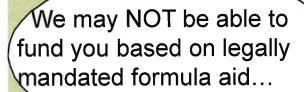
The Orange Public Schools did not receive any increase in state aid over the current year's aid, which makes it extremely difficult to maintain current programs and even implement new instructional initiatives.

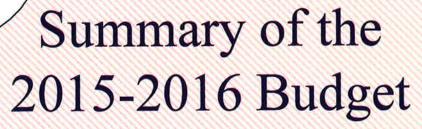
As a result of the prudent financial management of the Business Office, it was possible to provide the necessary funding to support the major increases in the budget, particularly in salaries and benefits.

In spite of the state's flat-funding, the 2015-16 budget does not include a reduction in positions or cuts in any academic programs.







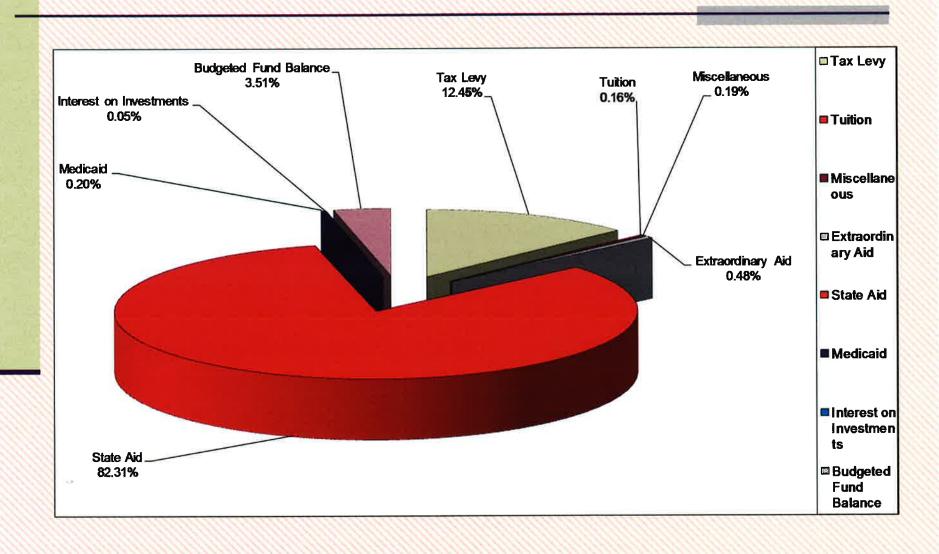

## % of Revenue by Source 2015- 2016

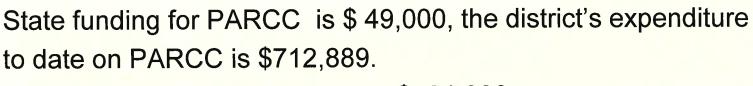
