


The Setting... A New York City orphanage for poor children who have no family.






Assistant Director

Director's Notes


Every time someone brings up the musical Annie, it always seems to remind people of their childhood. Those fond memories are one of the reasons why I chose this musical for our students. I wanted them to experience the world of Annie and to enjoy it just as their parents and others did when they were younger.

As an educator, a goal of mine was to enlighten the students about the hardships people faced during the 1930's Great Depression. My hopes were that they would find inspiration from one confident, little girl that brought optimism to everyone she met. This message, as well as the many other themes in *Annie*, rang true as we came together to produce this endearing musical.

Our students realized that this production would not be an "easy street" when I informed them we would be doing the full, two-act version of the musical instead of the *Junior* version. At times, it did make rehearsals feel like a "hard knock life." Through it all, we worked together and put all of our efforts into this production. Somehow, we knew that it "may be far away" but the "sun will come out tomorrow." Now, we "don't need anything but you" to sit back, relax, and enjoy *Annie* with us.
