

Melanie Arriola (Rafiki) — is a very good singer





Aaliyah has lots of interests off the stage too. First she is a serious, dedicated student at Forest who always gets good grades. In addition, she has been


a member of the Drill

the other kids who are new in the cast and crew. She wishes "Good Luck" to everybody in Disney and sends a shout out.




grow up," he says, I'd like to play in the NBA, and after that, perhaps open a nice restaurant or start some other business." We're confident that Asar is working on a winning plan!


that someday he might even play for the NBA! Daniel wants to thank the entire Disney team and he wishes *Good Luck* to the whole cast and crew.

time she loves to dance and flip. When she grows up she wants to be a teacher and an actor!


