A Writer's Festival: On Saturday, June 6, 2015, the annual writer's festival will be held at Lincoln Avenue School. Students in all grade levels will display their work from school portfolios. Some of the district's best selections will receive special recognition. ALL STUDENT AND PARENT authors are encouraged to participate as presenters and participants.

Great American Spellcheck Program: On the LAST MONDAY in September, students will take the qualifying assessment for the school spelling bee.

Commencing in October, There will be a video accepted on or before the 5th of each month on the topics listed to the right. Videos should be submitted BOTH electronically and on DVD (students should seek assistance from school's technology coordinator)

Order in the Court: NEW! *

Many of our students have participated in mock trial competitions and law fairs within individual schools or outside of the district. Our schools will present several cases over the course of the year on relevant issues.

CSI: NEW!

Students will participate as teams in multiple investigations requiring them to look at evidence, make hypotheses, analyze data, and draw conclusions.

GASP: Over the summer, students in grades K-7 should study the word lists found on spelling city. The link is below:

Students will receive pledge sheets in September for family and friends to pledge a small amount for each word spelled correctly on the qualifying exam. Finalists will go on to compete in their local school bee on a date between October 15 and December 15.

Winners of the grade level competition will be eligible to compete in the district's SPELLING BEE OF CHAMPIONS at OPA on Saturday, February 7, 2015. School winners are also eligible to compete in the SCRIPPS regional (Bergen County Community College) if the school has registered before October 15, 2014. Our FOLLOW THE READER reading challenge will officially commence on October 1. NEW students will register with the school's librarian. Former participants will continue with current username and password. The challenge will conclude on May 1, 2015.

HISTORY BEE finalists will be determined based upon a qualifying exam. These finalists will represent their schools on teams that will compete for the title of History Bee champion. 4 students overall will take the Online Regional Qualifying

Exam to earn a spot to compete in the regional finals of the National History Bee (Held in Orange, NJ in 2014).
