

Back to School Night at Orange Preparatory Academy











Back-to-School Night at Orange Preparatory
Academy, one of the district's three community
schools, was held on September 27. The school
welcomed returning and new Grade 8 and 9
families. The welcome began in the school's lobby
where parents and students picked up class
schedules and various information packages,
including information about the district's Parent
Academy the school's PTSO and more. Student
ambassadors assisted teachers, along with
Montclair State University staff, supporting Orange
Prep's community school model.

After gathering information, families were ushered in to the auditorium for introductions from Co-Principal Aretha Malloy. She gave an overview to families, presented the school's administrators, Assistant Principals, Mrs. Samantha Fossella and Mr. Noel Cruz, teachers by content areas, the school nurse and counselors. Ms. Malloy also introduced a new mantra - choices, "I will make the right choices and unleash my power." She highlighted that tardiness is not a choice, repeating that students must be in school no later than 8:15 a.m. to begin 1st block at 8:20 a.m. She also asked parents to complete lunch applications and surveys to help the school better serve students.

Before parents left to visit their child's classes, there was a brief overview given in Spanish by Ms. Vivian Paiz, district translator, and a message about the community school designation for Orange Prep by Ms. Stephanie Desange, Community School Coordinator.

to support Principal Dr. Erica Stewart.



Back to School Night at Rosa Parks Community School


With over 1,000 students, Rosa Parks Community School (RPCS) had a busy evening hosting the throng of families attending Back to School Night on September 28. Principal Ms. Debra Joseph Charles coordinated the effort by presenting to families by grade level, in two sessions. Parents of K through Grade 3 students met in the cafeteria starting at 3:30 p.m. and parents of Grade 4 - 7 students met beginning at 6:00 p.m.

At both sessions, parents had an opportunity to receive real-time translation of the presentation in Spanish and Creole from the district translators, Ms. Vivian Paiz and Mr. Specker Antoine. Headsets were handed out to those needing translation during each session.

Principal Joseph Charles gave a detailed overview of the school. She introduced the administrative staff: Mr. Oliverto Agosto, Dean of Students, formerly Assistant Principal, and Assistant Principals, Mr. Joshua Chuy and Mr. Terence Wesley, who is new to RPCS.

At the early session, there was a special presentation for Kindergarten parents, which reviewed curriculum information on *Work Sampling*, the *IRead Program*, *ST Math* and more, before parents visited with teachers. Kindergarten parents were invited back for the general presentation that detailed accomplishments, achievements and goals.

Ms. Joseph Charles proudly highlighted that RPCS teachers were recognized by the Superintendent for achieving high Student Growth Percentiles and that the school will once again participate in the Disney Musical in Schools program with the NJ Performing Arts Center. Last year the RPCS won a grant and successfully presented the Lion King Kids. The students were featured in an ad promoting the program (pictured below). This school year they will perform Aladdin. The school has also produced a Positive Behavior Support in Schools (PBSIS) instructional video to support character education.




Her goals for the coming year include improved attendance, reducing tardiness, increasing student achievement and continuing the improvement in the school's climate and culture.
