Orange High School Voter Registration for Week of Respect and Violence Awareness Week

On October 10 - 14, Orange High School collaborated with the National Association of Black Social Workers (NABSW) and the New Jersey Prepared to Vote organization to register eligible high school students to vote.

During this week, students were given information regarding the importance of voting and were encouraged to exercise their civic responsibility. In order to be eligible to vote in the upcoming presidential election, students needed to be age 18 no later than November 8, 2016 and submit their registration on or before October 18, 2016.

By the end of the week, 47 students and staff from Orange High School registered to vote!

The voter registration activity was tied to OHS's celebration of the New Jersey Week of Respect (10/3 - 10/7) and School Violence Awareness Week (10/17 - 10/21). In addition, the occasions facilitated discussion about the powerful effects of voting on local, state and federal levels. Students were encouraged to think about the laws that affect school and community violence.
