Rosa Parks Community School Pink Out Football Game Highlights

See Important Flyers Below On November 17 the Orange Public School District, in partnership with the City of Orange Township, launched the *Orange Page Turners Reading Challenge*, to promote the Orange Board Education's focus on building knowledge through a high volume of reading. The goal of the reading challenge is for the entire community to read one million pages, from November 25, 2016 through April 16, 2016. The launch event took place at the Orange Public Library, to a crowd of enthusiastic listeners. It opened in front of the library with a rousing performance by the Mighty Marching Tornadoes Band and Dancers, led by Band Director Dr. Steven Reeves, to display the energy behind this inspiring campaign.

Contact Information: Orange Board of Education 451 Lincoln Avenue Orange, NJ 07050 Send Us An Email "This challenge will get everyone involved in reading, from students and parents to community members, local businesses, community based organizations and municipal departments." said Ms. Karen Harris, Director of English Language Arts and Testing. She explained to attendees that not only is the campaign seeking maximum participation from students, the Orange community and commercial residents, but support is being sought, as well. Community members can fund prizes for the Orange Page Turners by pledging monetary donations in exchange for inclusion on streaming banners that will broadcast on the Orange Board of Education and City of Orange Township websites, at the following levels:

- Platinum (\$100) (name, business address, logo)
- Gold (\$75) (name, business address)
- Silver (\$50) (name)

Prizes for the top 3 readers will be awarded as follows: PreK-2, 3-5, 6-8, 9-12, community organization and resident.

The program also features a free book exchange where residents or businesses can locate a "My Free Library," book exchange "house," in front of their location for individuals to pick up a book and/or leave a book. During the launch, a sample house, constructed by the students at the Career and Innovation Academy (CIAO) was shown. Individuals can also donate money to CIAO to build a book exchange structure.

To register for the reading challenge, individuals can find the form link on the district's website at www.orange.kl2.nj.us. Registration forms will also be available at the library and local and school events. Another feature of the program is the availability of Reading Plus, a web-based structured silent reading program, which is available to all students in Orange and is being expanded to give members of the community access to the program. Reading Plus has been show to improve reading proficiency. "One of the needs for some of our students and members of the community," said Superintendent Lee in his remarks "Was improved literacy." He echoed the sentiment "Reading is Fundamental," and likened the goal of the challenge, crafted by Ms. Harris, to the Million Man March, and how it can be used to improve Orange's educational system and engage the community in this process.

The Honorable Mayor Dwayne D. Warren, at the launch event recounted that when he was called by the Superintendent about the reading challenge, "I was immediately intrigued with the ides." The Mayor along with the Orange Municipal Council and the Orange Housing Authority is partnering with the Orange Board of Education in this endeavor. Mr. Timur Davis, Director of the Orange Library, discussed the role the library could play in accomplishing one million pages read. Also providing support of the Orange Page Turners Reading Challenge are Scholastic Inc., Reading Plus and the Orange Education Foundation.

The entire effort will be tracked with *Page Turn-o-meters* (*Illustrated on left*). One will be placed in front of the Orange Public Library and the other at the Orange Board of Education Administrative Office.

- McGruff, The Crime Dog and the Orange Police Department: Students were
 provided with tips on how to avoid bullying situations. They shared videos that
 helped to reinforce the importance of giving respect and there was plenty of
 opportunity for audience participation.
- Oakwood Avenue Community School "Setting Trends for Others to Follow:" In recognition of National Wear Orange Day, themed "Together against bullying united for kindness, acceptance and inclusion," Pre-K through 7th graders spoke about violence in the community and performed inspirational cheers to help promote a positive school climate.
- <u>Bucket Filler Life Lesson On How To Treat People With Respect</u>: Students were challenged with, "Are You a Bucket Filler or A Bucket Dipper?" They were introduced to the Golden Rule... "Treat Others the Same Way that You Want to Be Treated." Use words that express kindness and respect for others. This is how we fill buckets. Saying harsh and cruel things may make a person to feel bad, causing the person to have an empty bucket.
- Bullying and Violence Prevention session with Mr. Reggie Miller, Director of the Male Student Support Program: Mr. Reggie Miller joined OACS in a campaign to brainstorm ideas to help improve the climate in the community. He encouraged positive behavior with the mindset that we collectively need to work together to bring about change in the Orange community. Mr. Miller encouraged those who go away to a college or university to return and bring the wealth of knowledge that the have back into the community to help promote a better Orange.



Emergency Preparedness and Fire Safety: Students were given a lesson on fire safety. The Orange Fire Department always does a great job in getting the students involved in demonstrating ways to preparing for an emergency and there are students and staff who were able to demonstrate how to put on the safety equipment that the fire fighters are required to wear when they are dispatched to help put out a fire. 
