Orange Teen Summit 2016

The Teen Summit 2016, sponsored by the Orange Public School district, was held on Saturday, November 19, with approximately 400 registrants. With dedicated staff from the district and numerous student volunteers to facilitate the event, students in grades 7 to 12, parents and guardians, participated in a summit that inspired everyone to realize, "Together, We Can Make a Difference!"

The students and adults first strategized how to make the community in Orange healthier, as part of the district's grant from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, which challenges communities across New Jersey to make changes and create long-term solutions for better living. Students and adults were divided into groups, and each group was given three questions. All the groups answered the same first two questions:

1. What does health mean to you? What do you need to be healthy?
2. What needs to be done to have Orange be the place people want to stay and live and also come back to after college, and how can we change the perception of what people think of Orange?

The third questions were different for each group; they included:

1. What can be done to make it safer in the community?
2. What would you need to be physically healthier?
3. Which activities would you like to participate in at the REC Center on Main Street?
4. What are some ways we could encourage teens to want to be successful in school?
5. How can we inspire our teens?

Adults were asked about the educational programs going on in Orange and how to get adults involved. They were also asked what can be done to get students engaged and off the streets. The groups discussed the questions and then reported their ideas to Mr. Lee and the Healthy Orange Coalition members.

The day started with a welcome from Mr. Ronald C. Lee, Superintendent of Schools, afterwards Nichelle "Brown Eyes" Brown did a short opening rap. Long time resident and doctoral student, Khemani Gibson presented a keynote address. Other highlights of the day included a flash mob and dance performance, choreographed by Debbie Rembert. The life workshops in the morning included a joint workshop on 'Family Concerns' and 'Living in the Hood' with school board member, Kyleesha Hill and college student, Rahmel Johnson.

There were two new workshops – "A Personal Trainer's Guide for Getting Healthier" and "Move Yo Mind" for girls only that shared how to reduce stress, improves concentration, and learn meditation. There was an adult workshop led by Healthy Orange Coalition members, University of Orange members, and Parent Academy members. Seton Hall athletes discussed the importance of grades and academic requirements. Lenny Williams, a professor and youth activist, led an inspiring talk on students' journeys toward academic transformation and future success. Dawan Alford, from Hands, Inc, organized a panel, "Bloom Where You're Planted: - Shifting the Narrative of Success from Escaping to Investing - A Comprehensive Strategy of Community Building and Cultivating Positive Leadership." He and his participants encouraged the students to find a mentor. Marcus Lawson, PharmD, discussed health-related careers. ShopRite's Dietitian, Sally Hammer, RD, shared information about nutrition. Sue-Anne Alonso, from Orange High School, introduced hydroponics (information about the high school greenhouse), and she shared lettuce that was grown in the greenhouse with participants.

There was an informative women's workshop entitled "Spiritual Surgery." At the same time, there was a men's workshop on "Investing in Real Estate in the Community" with James Hughes, a local real estate broker/sales person.

The afternoon workshops included: Dance! Zumba, acting, makeovers, Boot Camp, Finding Your Passion, and a discussion about medical careers with our school physician, Dr. Rosario Zambrano. Attendees finished the day with a dance competition and raffle prizes. Students also painted banners in English, Creole, and Spanish that stated, "Education Builds a Stronger and Healthier Community." The day concluded with raffle prizes.

Student comments have been numerous, including a request to do a summit every month. It was a day of truly inspiring and motivating workshops, presentations and activities. Laura Sacks, the summit organizer, was pleased with the event, as was Superintendent of Schools, Mr. Ronald C. Lee. They both exclaimed, "We hope everyone realized that, *Together, We Really Can Make a Difference!*"



Beyond Measure Film Screening



On December 5, from 6:00 - 8:30 p.m., at Orange Preparatory Academy, the Orange Public School District's Mathematics and Science Department will host a screening and discussion of the movie *Beyond Measure*. The film, directed by Vicki Abeles, author, parent and education advocate, is a follow up to her documentary about "the dark side of America's achievement culture," *Race to Nowhere*. In *Beyond Measure*, viewers are introduced to public schools across the country as they "embark on a journey to transcend the limits of an outmoded, test-driven education system and create a more equitable, empowering, student-centered education culture from the ground up." The film will show how groundbreaking school communities are implementing research based innovative models and transforming how and what they teach. The Orange Public School District may use practices illustrated by the trailblazers in *Beyond Measure* to model the future Orange STEM Academy. The event is free and open to the public.


