<u>Instructional Spotlight of the Week:</u> This week's Instructional Spotlight is from Cleveland Street School. Families recently enjoyed Family Literacy Night at Cleveland Street School. Teachers created several literacy-based learning stations throughout the school for families to enjoy, including but not limited to:

- Orthographic mapping
- A book tasting
- Activities related to adjectives
- Rhyming Words

Mrs. Layman's learning station focused on tapping, mapping, graphing, and writing words. This process is known as Orthographic Mapping. Orthographic Mapping is the mental process we use to permanently store words for immediate retrieval and become fluent readers.

First, Mrs. Layman reviewed different types of letter/sound combinations like short vowel words, digraphs (two letters that make one sound), blends (two letters that make two sounds pushed together), and many more. Then, the students and family members got to practice using a word mapping worksheet to identify all the sounds in a word to map, graph, & write it!

Finally, the students paired up and practiced mapping other words with a peer. At the conclusion of the event, students and their families were able to take home the mapping worksheet and a word list to keep practicing!







Ms. Paris' and Ms. Copeland's created a book tasting event, which exposed students and families to different genre and various types of books. They were able to create a relaxing, reading "cafe" ambiance. They wanted to give our students and their families the opportunity to choose books they wanted to read instead of being assigned a particular book.

There were different tables set up with different genres (fiction, non-fiction, graphic novels, biography, and the mystery special). The mystery special was a big hit! The students and families were not able to see the cover of the book. They judged it solely on reading what was inside. The students and families were then given a book tasting rating pamphlet and they were able to rate the books they browsed through.





Families who explored room 114 had the opportunity to engage in activities relating to adjectives. Ms. Sibilia explained the meaning of an adjective and gave some examples before reading the story The Napping House. Students and family members identified adjectives throughout the story. After reading the story, students and families walked around the room to find numerous characters from popular children's books and Television shows. With post-it notes, students labeled the characters with different adjectives. Students got to take home a bookmark listed with adjectives to continue adding more adjectives to their oral and written language.





Mrs. Baguidy shared a PowerPoint presentation with families that gave the parents information on the following... stats about early literacy suggestions on how to keep their young children engaged in reading. She then read a story with rhyming words and worked with the parents and students to create a rhyming word make and take.







Ms. Sequeira presented a lesson, discussion and activity about poetry geared to upper elementary and middle school students. Students and families engaged in a conversation about what constitutes poetry and what are the attributes of poetry needed to create a successful poem. Topics of discussion ranged from poetry structure to figurative language and rhyme. Students and families were able to select from a variety of poetry templates and leave with their own self-created poems.





At the end of the evening students and families were able to help themselves to FREE "Grab n' Go Books" to continue reinforcing what they learn during the literacy night and continue to foster a love of reading. All and all the Family Literacy Night was a huge success.

Students researched and created poster boards about their chosen person, with many dressed in character. Family members were present to support the students, hearing details from each personality. The first graders also gathered information from the wax figures on display, including Mae Jemison, Mary McLeod Bethune, Ida B. Wells, Maya Angelou, Madame C.J. Walker, Misty Copeland, Wangari Maathai, and Tu Youyou, among others. The students were prepared, discussing the women they represented with a clear understanding of their contributions to history.



Autism Grant Secured by Ms. Stewart from John Robert Lewis Early Childhood Center: April 12th was an exciting day at the John Robert Lewis Early Childhood Center. PSD teacher Mrs. Bronwynne Stewart was one of four special educators, out of nearly 900 submissions nationwide, to receive the ARIS Thrive Grant for Autism Educators from Stages Learning. Two representatives from Stages

Learning came to notify her personally, citing that Mrs. Stewart's heartfelt letter and application stood out among the other applicants and presented her with a grant worth \$10,000 in autism resources and support! Ms. Stewart's husband and their daughter's Godmother were there for the grant award presentation, with balloons and her favorite flowers. **Congratulations** to Ms. Stewart on your dedication to your students.
