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Course Description

Welcome to Strings! Please be advised that this is a performance-based class, and we will be performing solo and ensemble works for each other during class and for several concerts, events, and festivals throughout the school year.

This course is for students who are new to or continuing study of an orchestral string instrument - specifically violin, viola, or cello. We will learn to read music notation, ensemble pieces, chamber music, and solo repertoire from various genres.

Course Goals

- Develop the aesthetic sensitivity, musical knowledge, and independent ensemble performance skills of each orchestra member
- Develop high level thinking required for complex reasoning, critical thinking, problem solving, and listening skills through music performance
- Promote and develop positive interactions such as teamwork, cooperation, leadership, acceptance of differences, discipline, and creativity
- Enhance thinking in all other subjects while maintaining the integrity of music as its own subject

Student Objectives

- Perform independently and in groups a variety of string orchestra and full orchestra repertoire
- Perform with appropriate musicality, musical knowledge, and ensemble performance skills
- Demonstrate and utilize correct rehearsal skills and etiquette

Mission

The mission of the Orange Youth Orchestra is to provide exemplary musical experiences that enable players and audience members to be engaged actively and reflectively, using high quality examples of orchestral literature from a wide range of genres and eras.

*Video recordings may be required in lieu of an in-person performance. Please be advised that these video recordings will be MANDATORY and will count as test grades.

Concert Attire: Formal attire in all black is required for all performances unless otherwise specified. Skirts and dresses must be floor-length and tops must cover the shoulders.

Failure to adhere to the concert policies will result in loss of field trip and festival participation privileges, performing in the concert, and can result in failing grades.

Attendance

Attendance is mandatory and essential for developing musicians. Absences negatively impact personal growth as well as the overall ensemble's growth.

You are expected to be in class on time and ready to go every day. Those who arrive after the bell must have a pass to be admitted to class. Those who arrive late without a pass will be marked late and have points deducted from their daily classwork grade.

In the event our district or building implements virtual learning, all students are to report to the Google Meet on time with cameras ON and properly adjusted to clearly show their face.

Academic Dishonesty

Late Work
