# Welcome Back – First Day of School

The first day of school, on September 10, went smoothly for the Orange Public School District. Students did not let a little rain deter them as they filed into school, in uniform attire, equipped with backpacks and ready to get down to work. Interim Superintendent of Schools Ronald C. Lee visited the schools to show his support for the administration and staff and to greet students, as did Deputy Superintendent Dr. Paula Howard and district directors and supervisors. There was focused attention on Cleveland Street School students who are now attending Our Lady of the Valley (OLV) school, in anticipation of the planned renovation and construction of the Cleveland Street expansion. Interim Superintendent Lee and Business Administrator Adekunle O. James joined Principal Robert Pettit at the now vacated building, as parents dropped off children to be bused to OLV at 518 Valley Street. There, volunteers organized by the Healthy Orange Coalition and members of the Office of Community Engagement, greeted students and staff. The Orange Police Department provided oversight for parent and bus drop-off at the school.

## **Extended School Year**

The Department of Special Services 4th annual Extended School Year (ESY) celebration was held on August 9 at Orange High School (OHS) and Park Avenue School. The ESY program accommodated students requiring summer instruction to help maintain educational needs,

Students who participated in the program made presentations to family, friends and staff, showing their summer's work. The activities varied, depending on grade and covered specific *Thematic Units of Study* to enhance skills in the core subject areas of: language arts, mathematics, social studies and science.

At the high school, students used the Smartboard to make presentations about the Olympics and healthy eating. At Park Avenue, some of the lessons taught including ancient Egypt, from pyramids to "frontalism" art. Several students tackled entrepreneurship and philanthropy, developing a plan to produce and sell fruit sticks, raising funds for Mama Hope Global Advocates. The students also choreographed a dance routine to symbolize some of the African cultures represented by Mama Hope.



There were exhibits on the Jersey shore, plant life cycle, the water cycle, the solar system and rockets to outer space, child labor,

and an exploration of the countries through such things as flags, time zones and cultural symbols. Students were poised to explain their exhibits and were treated to a "homemade" amusement center where they enjoyed snacks and treats.

On August 23, Orange High School held orientation for the incoming Grade 12 students. Students, many accompanied by parents, came to this informative session as Assistant Principal Carrie Halstead stood in for Principal Jason Belton welcoming all to the meeting and to the all-important senior year. Assistant Principals Anne Richardson and Mohammed Abdelaziz, along with Supervisor of Guidance Frank Tafur supported her. Also present were Ms. Pia Frazier, attendance and truancy interventionist and Mr. David Ortega from the Space Program at Orange High School.

The messages involved graduation requirements, beginning with PARCC results, SAT scores and course and credit requirements. Attendance was reviewed including the new school day extension to 3:00 p.m., the state policy regarding excused absences before credit is loss and using the parent portal to monitor attendance.

Students were encouraged to be college ready with information about counseling programs and services at the high school, along with the college and career-planning tool Naviance. The on-site school based service The Space was reviewed and offered to students as an additional support.

Former student Ahmed Ahmed, who attends NJIT, addressed the gathering with advice on being realistic in preparing for college, noting the importance of frequent and regular visits to the guidance office. Planning is key!

## Preschool Registration for 2018-2019



The Orange Public School District Early Childhood Program has scheduled registration for the 2018-2019 school year for the following dates: Tuesdays, September 11, 18, and 25, from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., with the last sign-in at 12:00 p.m., at the Orange Early Childhood Center (OECC), located at **397 Park Avenue** in Orange.

The Orange Board of Education provides a full day preschool education for all three and four year old residents of Orange. There is no fee for the

school day (8:30 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.).

The registration requirements are:

- 3 or 4 years old by 10/01/18
- Must be resident of Orange Township
- Original Birth Certificate
- Child's Immunization Record
- Current Lease or Mortgage Statement (Note: If you are living with a friend or relative, you must be included in their lease agreement. Notarized letters stating you rent a room/apartment/house will not be accepted.)
- 2 Current Proofs of Residency (i.e. PSE&G bill, telephone or cable bill)
- Picture ID of the Parent

Additionally, the Orange Early Childhood Program includes all children regardless of abilities. If parents are concerned about how their preschool child is developing or learning differently, they can call the district to request an evaluation for preschool special education and related services.
