STEM Back to School Night

Principal Dr. Erica Stewart gave a full presentation to families on Back to School Night at the STEM Innovation Academy of the Oranges on September 25. Assistant Principal Devonii Reid, who detailed PARCC scores, supported her. The scores revealed high levels of proficiency for ELA and math among STEM Academy students. Dr. Stewart had teachers introduce themselves before leaving to prepare to receive parents and students.







Dr. Stewart highlighted, for parental action and attention, attendance, uniform requirements, required surveys, important school policies and procedures outlined in the student handbook.

Rosa Parks Community School Back to School Night

Rosa Parks Community School (RPCS) coordinated Back to School Night, on September 26, by presenting to families in two sessions. Parents of K through Grade 3 students met in the cafeteria starting at 4:30 p.m. and parents of Grade 4 - 7 students met at 6:30 p.m. The evening was hosted by Principal Ms. Debra Joseph Charles who introduced her administrative staff, new Assistant Principal Suzanne Carbone, Assistant Principal Terence Wesley and Dean of Students Noel Cruz.

At both sessions, parents had an opportunity to receive real-time translation of the presentation in Spanish and Creole. Principal Joseph Charles gave a detailed overview of the school, outlining "Great News," including the fact that RPCS is no longer designated a FOCUS School by the New Jersey Department of Education. Further, they won several of the district's competitions including the Spelling Bee and Math24. RPCS also showed the highest growth on PARCC among district schools. Assistant Principal Carbone reviewed the specific strides made in the school's ELA PARCC scores and Assistant Principal Wesley reviewed the improvements made in the Math scores.

Preschool Registration for 2018-2019



The Orange Public School District Early Childhood Program has scheduled registration for the 2018-2019 school year for Tuesday, October 30, from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., with the last sign-in at 12:00 p.m., at the Orange Early Childhood Center (OECC), located at 397 Park Avenue in Orange.

The Orange Board of Education provides a full day preschool education for all three and four year old residents of Orange. There is no fee for the school day (8:30 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.).

The registration requirements are:

- 3 or 4 years old by 10/01/18
- Must be resident of Orange Township
- Original Birth Certificate
- Child's Immunization Record
- Current Lease or Mortgage Statement (Note: If you are living with a friend or relative, you must be included in their lease agreement. Notarized letters stating you rent a room/apartment/house will not be accepted.)
- 2 Current Proofs of Residency (i.e. PSE&G bill, telephone or cable bill)
- Picture ID of the Parent

Additionally, the Orange Early Childhood Program includes all children regardless of abilities. If parents are concerned about how their preschool child is developing or learning differently, they can call the district to request an evaluation for preschool special education and related services.
