In this class you will learn how to creatively problem solve and tackle artistic challenges, while learning life long skills such as persistence, reflection, observation, and self critique. This is an advanced drawing class so you will begin start the course with reviewing some basics and tackling new media and more challenging techniques as the year progresses. This course goes into greater depth of skills to help you in higher level courses.

I know I can do better... can I resubmit work?


We learn more from our mistakes than we do from our successes, and a willingness to admit we have room to grow is the hallmark of any great artist. If you get a grade back you're not happy with, don't stress out - simply consider its critique or ask for help, then resubmit! Even an 'F' can jump to an 'A" if you're willing to give it the time and effort it demands!


Why do I need to write in class – can't I just draw?

We must learn that our work is ultimately a product that we produce. As we better ourselves as artists, we produce better "products". Writing critique can be difficult at first, but if you understand that it is designed to result in a better product, then it becomes one of the most important activities in your artistic growth. We will be writing using vocabulary as well as artist statements.

I'm not the best artist... will I struggle?

The question, I'm afraid, is a wrong one. Artistic skill is learned, not inherited (& science will back me up). No one enters a math class expecting to receive a grade for what they already know & an 'F' if they don't understand the next semester's worth of material they haven't yet heard about. In art class, one is graded on the application of fundamentals covered in class & their work ethic, NOT personal style or skill level.







This course has Drawing I as a Pre-Requisite. Drawing II builds on the variety of principles and techniques introduced in Drawing I. This course explores these basic issues more intensely, with greater detail and depth. Students will produce many drawings as the course emphasizes in-class drawing time with detailed attention from the instructor. The course aims to significantly strengthen the artist's observational and analytical drawing skills. Imagination and outdoor natural landscapes will be utilized along with in class still-life setups. Drawing II will introduce new media and their complexities. The human form is given a more detailed study.

Note to Parents/Guardians: The high school's annual art show takes place in June, and several other mini-art shows take place throughout the school year. Please be on the lookout (on the district website) for future dates for the students' artwork to be put on display.
