Program Spotlight: Graphic Arts

In the Graphic Arts program, students learn to use two industry valued programs, Adobe Photoshop and Adobe Illustrator. Students explore different avenues of visual communication, self-expression, and creative problem-solving by creating commercial, interactive, and fine art. Students produce page designs and write, edit, and proofread copy, captions, and headlines.

> The Graphic Arts program consists of the following courses: Graphic Arts, Web Design, and Graphic Arts Production. Students have the opportunity to earn 6 college credits from Fairleigh Dickinson University.

Graphic Artists enter the world of Graphic Arts with various educational backgrounds and certifications. Many of these workers offer specialized design services and digital content and work in advertising, public relations, and related industries.

Juggenheim Myseym

Ms. Martin's CTE Graphic Arts students visited the Guggenheim Museum in NYC. They viewed the exhibitions "Going Dark: The Contemporary Figure and the Edge of Visibility" and "Only the Young: Experimental Art in Korea, 1960s - 1970s." They had lively discussions about thoughtprovoking artwork and the design process with unconventional materials. Student Brandon Williams said he saw "fascinating and odd artwork, and overall it was great!"





Inaphic Arts Student Work

Students in the advanced Graphic Arts Production courses created a digital and print ad campaign for Hackensack Meridian School of Medicine as part of their marketing strategy to inform the public about their MINDS high school internship program. All students created composite photography and original graphic designs in Adobe Photoshop. This project provided students with the real world experience of designing a project to meet their client's needs within an established deadline.

Students in Graphic Arts selected a social justice issue and wrote taglines to convey a specific message. This required them to research public domain photos and edit the photos in Adobe Photoshop. The goal was to create original artwork which would correspond with the writing. The unique images were then combined with typography design to visually convey the message effectively.

Lincoln Ave. Cylinary Arts Visit




