Orange High School’s Cosmetology Program is designed to prepare students for exciting careers in the beauty industry. From hair styling and cutting techniques to skincare, makeup artistry, and nail care, students gain hands-on experience while developing customer service and business skills that are essential in the industry.

Throughout the program, students have the opportunity to work with professional-grade tools and products, practice on mannequins and live models, and even earn industry-recognized certifications. Whether students dream of becoming licensed cosmetologists, makeup artists, estheticians, or salon owners, this program provides the foundation they need to succeed.

Upon completing the program, students in Cosmetology will be able to sit for the State Boards Cosmetology Exam to become a licensed cosmetologist in the State of New Jersey



Cosmetology Students in Action

In Cosmetology, students have been busy perfecting two classic styling techniques – Finger Waves and Roller Sets. These timeless skills are essential for any aspiring cosmetologist, combining artistry, precision, and technique.

During class, students practiced creating smooth, sculpted waves using only their fingers and combs, mastering the control and styling needed for the perfect Finger Wave, a style dating back to the 1920s that is still used in modern hairstyling and fashion. They also worked on Roller Sets, learning how to section hair, apply rollers correctly, and understand how heat and setting affect hair texture and volume.

Both techniques allow students to build foundational skills in hair design, client care, and attention to detail, while gaining confidence in handling professional tools and products.

As students continue to practice and refine their techniques, they are not only building their technical skills by using industry-standard equipment, but they also preparing for success in the beauty industry, where attention to detail and quality service matter most!

Occupational Outlook and Careers in Cosmetology

Overall employment of barbers, hairstylists, and cosmetologists is projected to grow 7 percent from 2023 to 2033, faster than the average for all occupations.

About 89,100 openings for barbers, hairstylists, and cosmetologists are projected each year, on average, over the decade. Many of those openings are expected to result from the need to replace workers who transfer to different occupations or exit the labor force, such as to retire. In New Jersey, the average Cosmetologist makes \$43,440 per year.

Sariyah is a shining example of how dedication, real-world experience, and a strong educational foundation can pave the way toward success.




