What's the difference between a PTA and a PTO?

The technical differences
between a PTA and a PTO are fairly
simple. ... The PTA carefully protects its
name so that only dues-paying members of
the group can call themselves a PTA. PTO,
on the other hand, is a generic term. It
usually represents groups that choose to
remain independent.

Why Family and Community Engagement Matters

Partnership and student achievement are closely linked

Partnerships build public support for schools Families can help schools overcome challenges

Teachers benefit from partnerships It's required by law



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Students whose families are involved in their learning earn better grades, enroll in higher-level programs, have higher graduation rates, and are more likely to go to college.

Higher levels of respect and trust from community, better teacher morale, higher ratings of teachers by families, more success at implementing school reforms.

Collaboration between the community and schools to identify challenges, discuss productive approaches, and design and implement possible

solutions.



Educators can learn a great deal from parents: knowledge and perspective about their children, their culture and values, and the strengths and problems of their communities.



Rather than see parent engagement as compliance, take the opportunity and develop an effective school plan.

What is the Role of a PTO?

The role of your organization should be the answer of the following question:

"What does your school need from you right now?"

What is the Role of a PTO? (continued)

A PTO plays an important role in supporting schools and advocating for students by increasing family engagement.

The role is to help transform your school from a pile of bricks with books inside into a community where the kids know that they are not alone.

Six Types of Parental Involvement

According to Dr. Joyce Epstein (2011), there are six types of parental involvement:

- 1.Parenting
- 2. Communicating
- 3. Volunteering
- 4. Learning at Home
- 5. Decision Making
- 6. Collaborating with the Community

Mission Statement

Your mission statement should be **unique** to your group.

A typical mission statement is some version of this:

"ABC PTO is organized for the purpose of supporting the education of children at ABC Elementary by fostering relationships among the school, parents, and teachers."

Mission Statement (continued)

A mission statement answers the following questions:

- 1. What are the opportunities or needs that we exist to address?
- 1. What are we doing to address these needs?
- 1. What principles or beliefs guide our work?


