Since its inception in 2010, PII's Art & Essay contest attracts submissions from around 200 New Jersey schools. The contest consists of two categories, art and essay, and is made up of two participant categories, middle school (grades 6 through 8) and high school (grades 9 through 12). Each participant can compete in one or both of art and essay categories. 2019 PII Art & Essay Contest Theme:

SAVE THE EARTH'S NATURAL RESOURCES: "Can Our Children Enjoy The Same Resources and Beauty That We Have Had for Generations?"

- REDUCE waste by using less,
- REUSE containers and products,
- RECYCLE or REPAIR old products!

Definition of the Theme and Brainstorming Worksheet:

When planning your submission(s), it is important to think about the theme, SAVE THE EARTH'S NATURAL RESOURCES: "Can Our Children Enjoy The Same Resources and Beauty That We Have Had for Generations?"

In other words, try to think about the following:

- The Earth has a lot of beautiful places that has to stay same for new generations.
- Why does global warming matter?
- Can we stop climate change? How are we affected by the greenhouse effect?
- Could technology ruin nature? What can be done about it?
- How should we plan our lives to keep all of the Earth's natural resources safe?
- What are the consequences of waste (resources, food, energy, etc.)?
- How could I help increase awareness of environmental protection?
- How could I interact with someone who is not very sensitive about environmental protection?
- What do individuals do to prevent natural resources?
- What role can parents and school officials play to prevent wasting natural resources?
- What more could the state of New Jersey and law makers do to inform people about saving the Earth's Natural Resources?

The theme means much more than what comes to mind at first. When composing your work, feel free to be creative. Just remember you want to create a work that makes the reader/audience contemplate the theme and consider its importance in today's global context.



Who Can Participate & Important Dates:

Students at grades 6-12 from the State of New Jersey can enter the contest. Each student may submit only one work in each category.

- 1. The participants have to send their works by May 31st, 2019, at 5pm.
- 2. Winners will be announced on June 18th, 2019 via our Instagram account and website.
- 3. The awards ceremony time and venue will also be announced via same platforms.

Prizes for Each Category:

Grades 9 through 12:

- 1. First Place \$400
- 2. Second Place \$300
- 3. Third Place \$200
- 4. 5 mentions \$100 each.

Grades 6 through 8:

- 1. First Place \$400
- 2. Second Place \$300
- 3. Third Place \$200
- 4. 5 mentions \$100 each.

Contest Categories:

1. Essay Contest

- a. The participants must submit their essays online on <u>www.artandessay.org</u> by <u>May 31st, 2019</u>, at 5pm. (If you have difficulties to submit online you may mail to the address below)
- b. Essays must be original, unpublished, and written by one student.
- c. Each student may submit only one (1) essay.
- d. We ask teachers to sponsor students and guide them. We also ask them to <u>submit</u> essays online on students' behalf. Submissions by students or parents are not accepted. The number of submissions a teacher can sponsor per grade is limited to **five (5)** due to the high number of submissions.
- e. Each essay should be no more than 1000 words.
- f. Each essay should be written in Microsoft Word, double-spaced, Times New Roman font, size
- 12, and should not have any images in the document.
- g. Essays may be one of the following types: (1) Informative Essay, (2) Narrative Story, or (3) True Story
- h. Top three places and five mentions for each category of participants will have their names



published on the our website on <u>June 18th</u>, <u>2019</u> and will receive their prizes at the award ceremony.

Each submission will be judged on the basis of following criteria: (1) grammar, (2) uniqueness, (3) writing style and flow, and (4) understanding of the theme and its implementation in the piece.

- i. Each submission must include
 - Student name.
 - Grade,
 - School name
 - Sponsoring Teacher's Name, Phone number, and Email
- j. Participants automatically consent to their work being used and copied by Peace Islands Institute for promotional and/or informational purposes.

2. Visual Art Contest

- a. The participants have to mail their arts by May 31st, 2019 at 5pm.
- b. Artworks ranked in the top 15 will be displayed during the award ceremony.
- c. Participants may submit entries utilizing any medium in a 2-D format. Drawing, watercolour, oil paint, acrylic paint, collages, mixed media accepted. (No sculpture or photograph!).
- d. Submissions may be one of the following sizes: 16"X16, 16"X12 or 17"X11"
- e. A jury of art professionals will judge the submitted works on the basis of the following: (1) uniqueness, (2) creative/expressive use of materials, (3) artistry of execution, and (4) integration of medium and message (overall impact of the visual idea)
- f. Each submission must have on the back:
 - Student name
 - Grade
 - School name
 - Sponsoring Teacher's Name, Phone number, and Email
- g. Participants automatically consent to their artwork being used and copied by Peace Islands Institute for promotional and/or informational purposes.
- h. No artwork will be returned to students.



Announcements:

- 1. Each winner is responsible for his/her own transportation to the ceremony venue.
- 2. Check (awards) will be made payable to parents or legal guardians.
