



Orange High Student is a Finalist in the Eleventh Annual NFTE National Youth Entrepreneurship Challenge in New York City

On Thursday, October 6, 2016, approximately 40 finalists from across the US, who won regional competitions, will compete in the eleventh annual NFTE National Youth Entrepreneurship Challenge in New York City, presented by the Citi Foundation.



One of the finalists is Ami Phillips (***pictured left***), a junior at Orange High School (OHS). She qualified to compete, as a result of her participation in the Newark BizCamp, offered August 8-August 19, at Rutgers - Newark. Each year Rutgers - Newark hosts a BizCamp for Newark high school students, free of charge. The camp fosters entrepreneurial development and campers compete for the best product idea and business plan developed over the 2-week summer camp period.

The BizCamp, a product of the Network for Teaching Entrepreneurship (NFTE) New York Metro, culminates with students presenting an original business idea in hopes of winning cash awards to fund their entrepreneurial venture. Ami's venture, *J'adore Ami*, described as, "Safe, stylish and comfortable shoes (with detachable heels) for women around the world, at an affordable price," won her first place, along with a monetary award. Since then, Ami has been meeting with her mentor and preparing a demonstration of the removable heel concept to show at the competition.

OHS Assistant Principal, Ms. Carrie Halstead, had obtained a few slots in the Newark BizCamp for OHS students through a very good friend. Ami took advantage of this opportunity to develop her business skills. Ms. Halstead will accompany Ami to the competition on Thursday, October 6. Further, on Friday, September 30, Ami and her accomplishments were highlighted at OHS's first pep rally of the year, to encourage Ami as she continues to prepare for the competition.

The winner of the eleventh annual NFTE National Youth Entrepreneurship Challenge will receive a prize package valued at \$25,000 and the two runners up will each win \$5,000. There will also be a prize given after the National Challenge for Most Creative Marketing of the Elevator Pitch Challenge. . . . By presenting their plans at business plan competitions, students have a unique opportunity to practice their public-speaking skills, gain professional advice on their plans from competition judges, and receive well-earned public recognition, as well as award capital to invest in their businesses and/or their education.

NFTE also presents its Online Elevator Pitch Challenge award at the event. This winner is chosen from the finalists during a month-long social media contest leading up to October 6th. Sonic Explorations, Oakwood Avenue Community School's (OACS) El Sistema program, had a busy end to the summer and beginning of the new school year. In August, four of the senior-most *Sonic Exploration* students attended a three-day summer camp hosted by the NJ El Sistema Alliance at the Princeton-Blairstown Center. Gregory Burton, Latreesha Milford, Kenadi Stevens, and Jayda Holt spent three days with students from Union City, Paterson, Newark, Trenton, and Camden rehearsing music, building camaraderie, hiking, and making s'mores. This was the first year that OACS students attended the full three days.

The same four students were subsequently invited to perform for the book launch of Tricia Tunstall's new work about the global movement of El Sistema, *Playing For Their Lives*. The event, hosted at the Woodland in Maplewood, saw three of our students perform in a chamber orchestra of approximately 20 students from around the state. They played *Mambo Ambile* by Thom Sharpe and *Firework* by Katy Perry, demonstrating the joy and energy that characterizes El Sistema inspired music education.

Sonic Explorations will start up again on October 18 for another year of lively, collaborative music making at Oakwood Avenue Community School. The after-school music program, which began in the fall of 2013, provides violin instruction and general musicianship classes to Kindergarten through Grade 2.

First Board of Education Board Lobby Art Show Hosted by Park Avenue School



On September 19, Park Avenue School's art teacher, Mrs. Benay Lipstein, shared the creative work of her students at the monthly Board Lobby Art Show. 


