

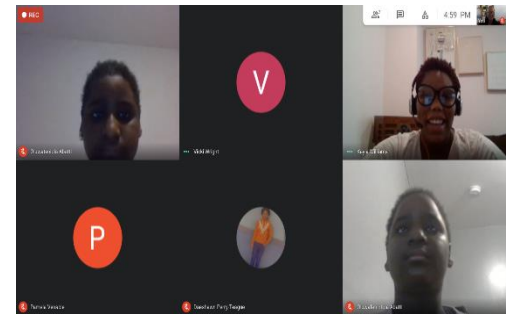

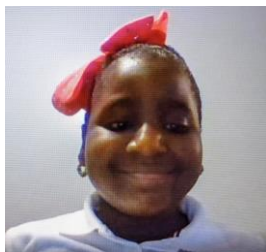
Our Scholars enjoyed the fun-filled, educational programs and have grown considerably, both academically and socially. We are Orange Strong! #goodtogreat

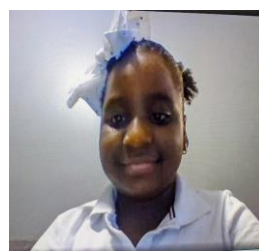

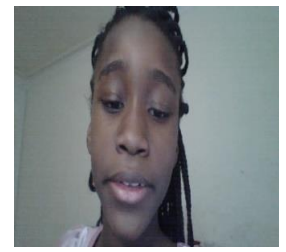
