












## TITLE

#### What is it?

Title I, Part A (Title I) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESEA) provides financial assistance to local educational agencies (LEAs) and schools with high numbers or high percentages of children from low-income families to help ensure that all children meet challenging state academic standards.

#### How does it help students?

Schools in which children from lowincome families make up at least 40
percent of enrollment are eligible to
use Title I funds to operate schoolwide
programs that serve all children in the
school in order to raise the
achievement of the lowest-achieving
students.

#### SMART GOAL 1

#### SMART GOAL 3



Community Curriculum that addresses the social and emotional needs of students.


#### **INTERIM GOALS**

APR 15: By EOC 3, teachers will implement two social emotional learning lessons in the classroom per month.










