

- •Although current ML's students made up 30% of test takers in grades 3 and 4 and had a passing rate of 9%, 75% of the students identified as Former ML's in these grade levels achieved a score of Meets or Exceeds.
- •This trend continued as overall the number of Former MLs passing increased 5 percentage points (36% to 41%).
- •On average per grade level Students With Disabilities make up 13.5% of all test takers. The overall passing percentage of Students With Disabilities increased by 3 percentage points.
- Taking the cohort of students into account, the number and percentage of students passing in grades 4-7 increased for each grade level.
