Revised Start Date for GED Program

For Orange residents interested in getting their New Jersey high school equivalency diploma, it's not too late to get screened and assessed for the Orange Public School District's GED Program. The district has added another screening session, to accommodate adults 18 years and older, on **August 5, 2013** at the Career and Innovation Academy of Orange. Please be prompt, the Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE) takes 2 to 3 hours! Individuals must test above the 9th grade level on the TABE, to participate in the program. Classes will be taught by JVS (the Jewish Vocational Service of MetroWest NJ).

The cost for the GED Preparation Classes is \$100, payable by money order, to JVS to cover books and materials. Students Enjoy Orange Preparatory Academy Transitional Program

For the second year in a row, Orange Preparatory Academy (OPA) offered a four-day transitional program for incoming 8th grade students. Students had the opportunity to review required classes and their locations, important school rules, available opportunities for students and to participate in team building activities.

The Transitional Program at OPA addressed the need for appropriate social interacting and developing good citizenship by breaking down personal barriers such as differences, stereotypes, and associated myths. This was accomplished by using student-to-student relationships; that included both one on one interactions and connections in small groups. The program also offered workshops on self-esteem, goal setting, anti-bullying and self-imagining. Because the students participated in engaging activities, it makes it far more likely that critical information was received and will be remembered. Students had the opportunity to attend one of two sessions offered in July. Session I was the week of July 15th and Session II the week of July 22nd from 12:30 – 3:30 p.m.

District 3 provided substantial subsidies for the students' attendance at the tournament. Additionally, the Shrine Bridge Club of Livingston, NJ contributed funds, along with donations from family members of Ms. Barbara Clark to the Orange Education Foundation (OEF) for transportation of the bridge club members. "We are so excited about this wonderful opportunity for our students and community," said Ms. Clark, retired Director of Special

Services and a bridge instructor and advisor for the Oakwood Avenue Bridge Club. Ms. Clark, who helped to organize and fund the trip, accompanied the students along with Ms. Pamela Venable, school counselor and Oakwood Avenue parent, Ms. Lisa Bryant. Ms. Clark is also the treasurer of the OEF.

Each summer a Youth NABC is held during the ACBL Summer NABC and \$1,000 college scholarships are awarded to the winners of the National Youth Open Pairs. In addition, a \$4,000 college scholarship, to be divided amongst the team, is awarded to the winners of the National Youth Open Swiss Team. Mr. Franklyn Ore Joins the Orange Board of Education


